

Chairman's Report



On behalf of the board of the Northern Football League I am pleased to present the League's 2008 Annual Report.

BUILDING THE FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

The year has seen considerable progress achieved as we strive to build stronger foundations for the ongoing development, success and growth of the game in our competition. Season 2008 saw growth of around 7.5%, or 300 new players, from 2007, and in the process we welcomed Fitzroy Stars Football Club into our senior competition.

Early in 2008, in conjunction with AFL Victoria, we saw the colocation of the Northern Region Development staff with our administration. This initiative has, and will continue to, add value to our efforts to grow, expand and enhance the professionalism of our league.

Looking ahead, there is still opportunity for more growth. There are 1,700 Auskick participants underpinning the future of our existing junior competition. Combined with the housing and building development occurring in many pockets of our region, scope certainly exists for more teams and grades to be added in future years.

The challenge going forward is to both capture and retain this growth, with the benefits flowing through to increased senior footballing opportunities in our region and within our league.

The recently introduced modifications to Division 2 for season 2009 are designed to make for a more even and competitive senior structure which not only attracts, but supports, the growth and retention in our senior competition.

We are also in the process of fully reviewing the approach to Junior Development, in particular the need to align our pathways and development management along 'best practice' lines. It is expected that the outcomes of this will further enhance the strength and attractiveness of our competition to budding footballers in the area.

General Manager's Report



This year represented the first full operational year of the Northern Football League.

The NFL's Vision, Mission, Values and Objectives within our 2008 – 2010 Strategic Plan was a living document – created via extensive consultations with all our stakeholders; that included, all senior and junior NFL clubs, NFL umpire representatives, the NFL Board and an array of individuals external to the NFL, including local governments.

Our overall objectives for 2008 to 2010 are clear:

To build a foundation for ongoing development, success

We have implemented, and continue to maintain, effective systems of governance, financial management, administration operations and performance monitoring. I believe significant inroads have been made to develop innovative income streams to fund development of the league and member clubs. Revenue from sponsorships, advertising, royalties and licence fees totalled \$159,091 compared to \$23,650 in 2007. We will continue to strive to grow this further in 2009, although the current world economic climate will no doubt present many challenges.

Develop an effective structure for senior and junior competitions with regard to desire for quality, evenness and competitiveness.

In our junior competition this year, we introduced grading of teams. This is designed to ensure teams are competing against teams of similar abilities. The grading is assessed on the performances of teams during rounds 1 to 4. The average winning margin reduced from 58 points in rounds 1 to 4 to 43 points for the remainder of the season. I believe this will be enhanced even further in 2009 with additional data available to assist the grading process.

In our senior competition we have signalled our approach to develop a 3rd division in 2009. It is my belief that all clubs currently in 2nd division will benefit from this initiative. Playing in a competition that provides an even and competitive fixture will generate interest within our communities, and ultimately extra bodies though the gates.

Significant inroads have been made to strengthen the pathways from Auskick through juniors and seniors. We have 38 registered Auskick clinics in the Northern Suburbs, 20 of them directly linked to Northern Football League clubs. Another 12 are school based clinics, and this year we introduced a primary school based football competition designed to link schools to there local NFL junior club.

A complete overhaul of our umpiring structure, direction, management, recruitment, retention and ongoing development, was completed this year. New training programs, and the establishment of school based programs, including an Umpires' Academy at Parade College, were introduced by our Director of Umpiring, Kevin Smith. Results were spectacular with an additional 51 field, 20 boundary and 11 goal – a total of 82 new umpires recruited to the Northern Football League this year. Of these new umpires, 60 are aged under 25. I would like to thank Kevin Smith and his support team on a wonderful result.

An extensive review of our approach to junior talent identification programs and representative teams has been conducted, with a complete overhaul to be introduced in 2009. Tailored programs will be conducted at Under 12.13.14 and 15 level.

To develop, build and vigorously promote a credible NFL Brand and image to attract participants, stakeholders, sponsors and contributors.

The 2008 season kicked off with a major season launch at the Art House in Heidelberg. It was a wonderful opportunity for clubs to meet and socialise in an informal, relaxed environment after a long pre-season. Our new media manager, Kirsten Darnell, was on board, further enhancing our weekly football record publication, the Northerner, and our radio production. Kirsten left us late in the year, but we were fortunate that Josh Berriman, who had been providing articles for the Northerner, was available and agreed to take on the Media Manager's position. His commitment and attention to detail ensured that our record publication and radio production continued to grow and improve. Thank you to Josh for your commitment to meet deadlines and desire to continually strive to grow our product.

Our partnership with AFL Victoria in having Community Development Manager, Phiv Demetriou, and Ashley Brown, based at the Northern Football League office, provided us with the benefit of being able to introduce a number of community wellbeing programs, including: Cultural Diversity Seminar, Bouncing Racism Out Of Sport, Problem Gambling, Respect and Responsibility (the only league in Australia to conduct this program), and Quality Club Accreditation - our aim for 2009 is to ensure all clubs achieve Bronze and/or Silver level.

In addition to the above programs, throughout 2008 we also conducted: Coach Education Courses, School Football, Auskick, Clinics in Schools, Coaching Seminars, as well as a Super Clinic during the term 2 holidays.

Aim to have sufficient quality grounds and facilities to meet current and future needs of a growing Northern Football League.

One of our most important partners are the local government authorities that govern within the Northern Football League. I am pleased to say that we have developed an excellent working relationship with all of our local authorities, and will work hard to further enhance these relationships during 2009.

We are, however, still searching for a suitable permanent training base for the NFL Umpires. This year we were fortunate to be able to share Heidelberg Park with Heidelberg West Football Club. Thank you to Joel Cheers, Heidelberg West Football Club, and the City of Banyule, for welcoming our umpires to use your venue as their

To attract, recruit, retain and develop quality people at all levels in the Northern Football League.

We depend heavily on volunteers in running our competition. To support, develop and recognise our volunteers, we introduced the Northern Football League Volunteer of the Year Award that was presented to Tom Gard from Parkside Football Club at our Senior Presentation Night. Congratulations Tom.

In 2008, we also provided the opportunity, and strong encouragement, for clubs to gain all appropriate accreditation for their coaches, players, administrators and volunteers. I am delighted with the outcomes:

96% of senior coaches were accredited 85% of junior coaches were accredited 75% of clubs attended all programs provided

2008 was a solid season financially, however we need to build on that further. We need to aim at developing more financial support from outside the league, and in the current economic climate this will be very challenging. The economic climate would also suggest that club sponsorship may also be tenuous, so please take a conservative approach - endeavour to cut costs wherever possible, and avoid the temptation to spend promised money before it is received. I encourage all clubs at all times, to monitor and update your budgets regularly, in particular during these hard economic times. Ensure you operate only within your financial means, and ensure your future in the Northern Football League.

The NFL has been fortunate to have a Board that shows considerable foresight and integrity. In particular, I would like to thank Frank Rosbrook for his support and guidance to me and my office staff.

I would like to thank the Community Development team of Phiv Demetriou, Ashley Brown and Graeme Pratt for their assistance and dedication in the development of football in the NFL

And the balance of my office staff: Delwyn Berry in Administration and Jarrad Carey in Football Operations. Both have enormous commitment to their roles and do a terrific job for the NFL.

Football Operations' Report



2008 was another successful year for the Northern Football League, culminating in an outstanding Division One Grand Final between the two clear standouts of the season. Our finals series was the talk of the town, for all the right reasons.

It was all hands on deck during the senior and junior finals, and I'd like to thank everyone who chipped in, either as hosts, ground managers or miscellaneous! A special thank you to Phil and Sue Aston and their team for all your hard work and long hours at Cramer Street.

Speaking of Cramer Street, this year saw the return of Interleague, when our best took on the boys from the Essendon District Football League. The day was a resounding success, with a great crowd and three fantastic football matches. I can't wait for the return fixture in 2010

One of the most exciting changes to happen to the league is still in its infancy stage. Our Junior Development Program is currently under review so keep a look out for a new and exciting pathways system that will be the envy of other leagues. This is yet another way that we can get people talking about our league.

It was a clear focus to strengthen and develop our C Grade competition, with Friday night matches in particular, providing increased crowd numbers and greater player availability. The league

is working with councils to upgrade lighting at grounds to continue our push for an exclusive Friday Night C Grade Competition. We expect our numbers in C Grade to be at an all time high in 2009, with several clubs already indicating they intend to field two sides, notwithstanding the possible inclusion of an Under 19's St Mary's side.

The Presentation Nights were a terrific showcase of the best and brightest talent the league has to offer. It was great to see so many clubs enjoying each others company away from the hustle and bustle of match day. The Senior Night continues to grow and our 'Top 3' competition raised almost \$500 for the Olivia Newton-John Cancer Centre, with Joel Cheers from Heidelberg West the lucky winner. Special recognition to all the gorgeous partners who accompanied their husbands and boyfriends to the senior night, we hope to see even more next October.

One of the biggest challenges came early on, with the introduction of Junior grading creating some logistical nightmares for fixturing, particularly after the conclusion of Round Four. The league enlisted the help of some club delegates, forming a Grading Sub-Committee that assisted in the re-grading before Round 5. The proof was in the pudding by seasons end, with average winning margins reduced from 58 points to 43. This was a great result in only the first year of grading and the process will tighten and bring all competitions closer in the coming years. There is no doubt that all the hard work was well and

truly worth it and it was brilliant to see so many kids experiencing the thrill of playing finals football for the very first time.

At the end of 2007, it was clear that our umpiring ranks needed a shake up with numbers dwindling, particularly in the lower age bracket. The league introduced 82 new recruits who will hopefully be involved with us for many years to come. Kevin Smith has put in place some wonderful initiatives which will ensure the future success of our umpiring, with programs and academies in place with several schools throughout the northern region.

Like the umpiring group, our Independent Tribunal found itself in a transition phase at the conclusion of 2007 due to mass retirements. It is never easy to recruit volunteers to sit on tribunals, but the 2008 panel contained seven fresh faces, including three new chairmen. Greg Hughan and Ian Freckleton, both QC's with extensive football knowledge, added invaluable legal expertise and great enthusiasm, while Wally Tyrell, with over 20 years of experience in Football Tribunals, provided leadership and understanding to the entire panel. Thank you also to tribunal secretary, John Garlick, and the rest of the 2008 panel for giving up many Tuesday nights.

To my colleagues at NFL House, congratulations on an enormous 2008. Delwyn has done an outstanding job in getting the netball competition up and running, as well as making sure all things

administration still motor along smoothly. Thanks to Kevin Crompton for all your support, direction and leadership. The league continues to grow under your supervision. To Phiv and his army of AFL Victorians, thanks for all your assistance and advice throughout the year. Special mention also to Steve, Garry and Quentin at the Bullants and PK and his team at the Knights. Let's hope the link between the three of us continues to tighten in years to come.

And finally to all the volunteers that make local football possible. Thank you to the trainers, presidents, water carriers, runners, coaches, secretaries, team managers, canteen attendants, treasurers, timekeepers and many more. Your passion and devotion does not go un-appreciated and without you the Northern Football League simply would not exist.

Media Report

To build on the success of the 2007 season, the Northern Football League introduced a full-time Media Manager position in 2008 to raise awareness of the league in the northern suburbs of Melbourne. In the weeks leading up to the beginning of the season, Kirsten Darnell was appointed to the role, and her initial tasks included organising the season launch and developing a football record from a blank canvas.

In the face of the initial time constraints, Kirsten was able to implement a consistent and thorough football publication in the *Northerner*. Throughout the season, the *Northerner* strengthened its content to include more club-related items, including feature articles on interesting happenings around the league and weekly club notes. Kirsten was able to build great lines of communication with all the league's clubs and they embraced the exposure that could be offered to them through the record. Thank you to all those who contributed for season 2008.

Another area where clubs were able to gain exposure through the league was via our weekly radio programs. This year saw the Saturday pre-game show broadcasted directly from the 'match of the day' ground, giving the commentators the chance to speak face-to

-face with players, coaches and officials of the participating clubs who generously gave up their time on game day. Following this, the game would then be called by the partnership of Mal Cooper, Dylan Maxwell and Mark Donnelly. A big thank you to these guys for their hard work on the weekends throughout the season, sometimes in difficult conditions, but always contributing positively to the league's coverage.

As well as the match day programming, the league hosted an additional two radio shows on 88.6 Plenty Valley FM. The Monday Night Variety Show pitted players from different clubs against each other in a battle of wits during the half hour trivia challenge, while the Friday Night Preview show, as suggested, previewed the games to be played over the weekend. Thanks to Football Operations' Manager, Jarrad Carey, who made himself available for these shows throughout the year, with either Kirsten, Mal or myself.

Also a special mention to Dylan and Luke Devincentis for their work on the NFL Junior Show throughout the year, and also their efforts in commentating on all three Division 1 Grand Final DVDs.

Another initiative that the league started in 2008 was to publish

articles in the *Northerner* from the league's match reporters; a collection of local school and university students, or just people interested in the Northern Football League. It gave the writers a great opportunity to get their work published on a weekly basis and put together a portfolio of articles featuring their by-line. Thank you to Matthew Borg, Ashleigh Cole, Marcus Harrington, Natalie Savino and Anastasia Volpe for the regular contributions throughout the season, as well as Marq and Jackson Bellingham for their weekly match previews. We hope you all continue on with us for the coming season.

Towards the 2009 season, the league is looking to have a greater presence through its online media. The current Northern Football League website (www.nfl.org.au) has been underutilised, and with an across the board revamp, we are hoping that it quickly becomes the main communication tool of the league and the first source of information for the NFL community. We are only now exploring the possibilities that a contemporary website can offer in terms of new media opportunities, but these changes promise to be exciting for all involved. It may mean a lot more digital correspondence between clubs and the league, but ultimately the results will be beneficial for both parties. Having a wider reach and a greater audience coming

in contact with the league's communication is the desired outcome.

The progress the entire league has made in its media efforts over the past two seasons has been out-of-sight. We still have plenty of opportunities to improve and reach our potential in the future, hopefully making our league celebrated for its initiative.

Junior Chairman's Report



The junior committee went through a changing time this season, with the previous Chairman, Gary Green, resigning just after the start of the football season. I took on the role with a limited background in junior football, but throughout the season I continually learned what was required for the role and the opportunities open to us. So I would like to thank my fellow committee members- Noel, Wayne, Michael, and Mark- for their continual support and guidance.

Congratulations to all the junior players, coaches and club officials who put their time in each week to improve the quality of local junior football within our region. It's these people who are the main drivers behind improving the NFL Junior competition and the more help they can receive, the better our league will become.

This season saw the successful implementation of the grading system, where the NFL tried to ensure that there was more evenness within the final results of junior games. I felt this was eventually well received by the clubs. It also, like most things, brought a few changes to the way each junior club ran. No longer were their a set number of junior games at grounds, and sides didn't always play at the same time, or follow the same team each week. These things the NFL is working on for next season to ensure that there is a smoother, workable solution that benefits all clubs and helps them in their Sunday operations.

So what challenges do we face in 2009? The total review of the NFL development program has started. This will include looking at all levels, starting at Auskick and including all age levels all the way through to senior football. I am excited on where that is going to take our league. A review was needed on how the NFL develops its players as I felt it had become apparent that the structure we did have, didn't link to the NFL's strategic direction and business plan.

As well the review of player development, other important policies and changes will include:

- The Development Program for the NFL, as mentioned.
- Behaviour Cards for coaches' benches this will be ready by the start of 2009 season.
- 100% Accreditation of Junior coaches Last season we had
 85%, in 2009 100% is an absolute must.
- Getting an Under 16 competition going in 2009 to ensure all age levels are represented within the NFL.
- Ensure that no alcohol is being served at any junior grounds while junior games are being played.
- Ensure all junior clubs provide financials to the NFL.
- All junior clubs to have a business plan.
- Look at the tribunal and fine structure for juniors.

• Communication and Marketing - Junior details in the NFL record on a Saturday.

Another issue I see is the NFL developing roles for our different stakeholders. The five different stakeholder roles I currently believe are important to the running of our league are:

- Players
- Parents
- Coaches
- Umpires
- Club Officials

Working With Children (WWC) Legislation

WWC Legislation became law on 1 July 2008. Sporting clubs have been given until 1 July 2009 to comply with the requirements under the new legislation. Our General Manager, Kevin Crompton, took a leadership role on this matter in our region and in conjunction with the Victorian Department of Justice and our local councils, arrangements are in place to conduct seminars with not only our own people, but through local government invitations and all other sporting bodies in the region. Another strong and positive sign of "Communities Working Together".

The purpose of these seminars is to explain the requirements and implications of the new legislation and provide valuable opportunity to clarify concerns. The change will have an impact on all junior clubs, but senior clubs need to also know and be aware of the requirements. Well done Kevin on expediting this matter within our league and the broader communities.


Next season again will raise issues for the league and with a plan to go forward, I'm sure that everyone can met and overcome anything that comes upon us.

Umpire's Report

The 2008 NFL season saw a new coaching set up for the umpiring group, which brought with it a number of changes, including a different training venue.

Due to drought conditions, an appropriate pre-season training venue was difficult to find. The group initially trained in the Rosanna Parklands and used Macleod Juniors home ground as its base.

The umpiring group then made its home for the season at Heidelberg Park, home of the Heidelberg West Football Club, and trained weekly on a Monday and a Wednesday evening, with coaching sessions held after training each Wednesday.

The facility was a fabulous one due to a sizeable social room and two good size change-rooms, not to mention a great oval and plentiful parking available. I want to thank those at the football club for allowing the group to share its wonderful facility.

On the main night of training, umpire numbers averaged 121, when you include the Academy boys. Sometimes they attracted as many as 130 umpires in total between the two groups. The dedication of these umpires was truly great to see. Each of the three disciplines

(field, boundary and goal) experienced lots of specialised skill drills, fitness training and feedback on performances.

I would like to thank Kim Miles (Fitness Coach), Darren Agnew (Juniors Umpire Coach), Shane Herbert (Goal Umpire Coach) and Doug Armstrong (Boundary Umpire Coach) who worked so diligently and successfully throughout the season. A big thanks must go to Brian Moore (Secretary of the Coaching Panel) who worked so tirelessly across all disciplines to ensure the smooth running of umpiring. To these, along with all those who supported each of the coaches, and those who carried out observations and mentoring, your magnificent efforts were appreciated and resulted in many umpires having a feeling of support whilst showing significant improvement.

A program of involving schools in the running of a Basic Umpiring Course as part of their curriculum continued in 2008. Negotiations are currently continuing with a further five of the larger schools in our area to have them run the course in 2009. Visits were made to schools to address assemblies and selected grades with recruiting in mind, and this will be increased next season.

The opening of an Umpiring Academy at Parade College was a big success, and was of benefit to the school, student participants and umpiring numbers. A number of students proved good enough to be appointed to junior grand finals in their first season, with two of them reaching Under 19 level.

There were 51 field umpires, 20 boundary umpires and 11 goal umpires recruited in 2008, which is a good start. Of the 82 recruits, exactly 60 were 21 years of age or younger. 15 of the 17 young umpires appointed to one or more Under 19 games for the first time, had an average age of just 15 and a half years. It's now a matter of retaining at least the majority of them, and this will largely be influenced by their acceptance, or otherwise, of the club environment in which they umpire during the season.

In 2008, there was no need for any umpire to officiate eight quarters on a Saturday. The only doubling-up occurred when an experienced umpire officiated with a younger field umpire in the Under 19s. Additionally, there was no need for a one umpire system in any Reserves matches this season. One of our recruits umpired a Senior match in his very first season of umpiring.

An important initiative was the holding of an umpire/club evening early in the season, where each senior club had an umpire attend training to talk with the players about the priorities for umpiring during the season.

Each of the NFL administration, led by Kevin Crompton, were always available to discuss umpiring matters. They readily tendered new ideas for discussion, and offered and gave assistance when asked, or it was appropriate to do so. On most days of the week, each of the staff were involved in umpiring in some way and I always felt the support was there for umpiring-I am thankful for this.

The Umpires Association, led by Craig Herman, supported both myself and the umpiring group with its role of providing an appropriate umpiring environment. It arranged meals and refreshments after training, through Kerryn and Gary, a successful trivia night was held, and both the junior and senior Presentation Nights were a big success. Providing an experienced umpire as an advocate for umpires at the Tribunal was also an important role it performed, and I want to thank the Association for its efforts throughout 2008.

The umpiring in the finals series, both in juniors and seniors, was outstanding in all disciplines and contributed to a high standard of football. The introduction of the three field umpire system for Division One Seniors was a magnificent success, as was the three boundary umpire system for both Senior Divisions. I want to congratulate all those receiving a final and/or Grand Final appointment; you deserved it






