



















Chairman's Report

Ron Bongetti

On behalf of the Board of the Northern Football League I am pleased to present the League's 2010 Annual Report.

I have once again used the framework of our Business Plan to formulate this report.

To build a foundation for ongoing development, success and growth

Over the past twelve months the NFL moved from being simply a local football league to playing a far more important role. We are now being seen as an educator and an important member of a very diverse community.

A number of things have led to this occurring and I will deal with them more throughout this report, however none of it could have occurred without the support and assistance of our Members, the Board and Management of AFL Victoria, and the many people we engage or conscript into assisting us.

With a growing number of teams many organisations would be happy, however we, our Members and the NFL Directors and office, moved to continue to grow our reach. A prime example of this is our growing numbers of NFL Netball teams.

We have also spent the past twelve months considering adding the management of Youth Girls' football to our charter and at this stage it would seem to be very likely to do so. There are still some i's to dot and t's to cross but once these are taken care of we intend to move down that path. The Board has certainly philosophically supported the idea.

Last year I pointed out that: "We make up the largest component of the football community in AFL Victoria's Northern Region and as such we are cementing ourselves as we continue our work in 'Communities Working Together. This stands even more true as we move from 2010 to 2011.

To build quality football competitions and clubs at every level in NFL

At the 2010 NFL Season Launch I pointed out that our league is now being considered as a "ball-players" League; one where good footballers can join and expect to be supported. Our tolerance level of unsavoury incidents is strict and unwavering and for this we should all feel proud.

Division 1 was the most competitive competition seen in the north for a long time. While Heidelberg was still the benchmark during the home and away season, they were continually challenged and showed that any team not at full strength and playing their absolute best is very beatable in our League.

We introduced a Final Five and this certainly added to the excitement later in the year with a number of clubs eyeing off that final spot as we neared the end of the year. Eltham were the team that won the right to feature in their first final series for a very long time. Despite going out in a very competitive first final they nonetheless showed they are on the right track.

We added a team into Division 3 with St Mary's fielding a senior team for the first time. Regarded as Australia's most successful Junior Club they now have a number of juniors and former juniors looking to once again wear their famous strip. I thank all their opponents for seeing the big picture this season and allowing them to field a team without the assurance of a Reserves team. Fortunately for all, and due to plenty of hard work by their management group, early in the season they saw their numbers grow to a level where they could field teams in all three grades. Well done to all involved.

Our netball added another division and continues to exceed expectations, and is rapidly growing into a very, very good competition in its own right. No longer are we simply a League providing a competition for the ladies;



ours is a quality competition with a very solid following. The fact that we moved our Grand Finals to the State Netball and Hockey Centre was another example of our seriousness and the quality of the competition. Watch for more exciting growth in 2011.

Following on from 2010 our Junior Committee reinforced its intention to grade our junior competitions. This provides all juniors with more of an opportunity to play against players of their own calibre. The result of a more competitive league is very satisfying and I congratulate Dean Philpots and his committee on their determination to deliver a quality competition and one of which we can all be proud.

It has been interesting to watch the growth in the management of our clubs. We will always have some moving in either direction but overall the enthusiasm for the task at hand is very encouraging. The Board has adopted a philosophical position to always work with clubs so as to develop their off-field performance. I have competition is traveling very well: we are now looking to no doubt that this is the way to go.

This year we saw the introduction of the Frank Rosbrook Medal for the winner of the Division 1 Best and Fairest. The inaugural medal was won by West Preston's Nick Meese and three of the Rosbrook family were in attendance to present it to Nick's father, John, as Nick was overseas. This is a fitting tribute to a gentleman who set the tone that this League has successfully adopted.

Finally congratulations to West Preston for winning the Division 1 premiership; likewise my congratulations to Whittlesea (Division 2) and Hurstbridge (Division 3) and good luck to the latter two as they move into higher divisions. Likewise I congratulate Diamond Creek Blue (Section 1), Mernda A (Section 2) and North Heidelberg B (Section 3) on their NFL Netball premierships.

In wrapping up the congratulations, I congratulate the 24 junior clubs that took out their premierships in 2010, including West Preston Under 16's who won our first Under 16 Grand Final. There is no doubt that our Junior see the fruits of this in our inter-league competitions.



Chairman's Report

To develop, build and vigorously promote a credible NFL Brand and image to attract participants, stakeholders, sponsors and contributors

This season saw us take enormous steps in building our brand. If there was any confusion as to what the League stood for then all became clear this year with the following highlights leading the way:

- Our ongoing relationship with merchandise supplier Hot Sublimation showed that we can deliver quality merchandise at a competitive price. With all clubs now sporting our NFL Branded merchandise we are certainly moving in the right direction and doing it together and in harmony.
- Our Season Launch was once again a fitting way to commence the season with representatives from clubs, councils and sponsors all in attendance. This will continue to be a wonderful occasion and one to look forward to.
- Our commitment to be a quality influence on the community at large was an outstanding success. Our education program has been seen as ground breaking and I will speak more on that shortly.
- Our ability to continue to attract players, coaches, umpires and volunteers is amazing. My thanks in particular to the Northern Umpires Association and our umpires for their unswerving support of the NFL ideals. Their policing of our game is terrific and it is no coincidence that we are the only league in Victoria, and possibly Australia, that is able to provide a full compliment of umpires for all senior games and field umpires for all junior games. My thanks to the clubs for their monitoring of the behaviour of our participants.
- Our ability to stage quality events is growing as evident in our staging of the Launch, our Finals Series, our Junior and Senior Presentation Nights and this year a key lunch featuring Andrew Demetriou. The lunch was a terrific first effort and I thank our clubs and local politicians for getting behind it, and offer my personal thanks to Phiv Demetriou for his influence in getting Andrew to commit to the lunch. This may become a feature event in future years.

 And how about our ability to get the Prime Minister to attend a Junior Grand Final at Diamond Creek? This was an unexpected highlight and certainly made a couple of our juniors well known amongst their peer groups.

I wanted to delve more into our Social Responsibility Education Program and point out the exciting news that the NFL was this year nominated for the vicsport 'Best Sports Development Initiative by Industry Associate / Corporate Supporter vicsport Member' award.

We were nominated by AFL Victoria but unfortunately we were pipped at the post by a program run by Football Federation Victoria – the state soccer association. The fact that we were even nominated against a number of state associations is a terrific feat.

But the most exciting news was the fact that we were nominated and won the Victorian Government's 2010 Community Sport and Recreation Award, presented by Sports Minister James Merlino. Two awards were issued in this category by the Minister and this time we and Football Federation Victoria both beat a number of quality programs.

This is not why we introduce such programs but it is a great fillip to know that what we are doing is now being endorsed by the Victorian community at large.

Having sat in on a session and having seen the format, I congratulate all involved and offer the Board's appreciation to Peter Gilson and his team at Impact Football Solutions. I also thank Phiv Demetriou and Ash Brown for their support of the program.

There has been a huge culture shift within the League and the role of women in our sport and our league is now extending far further than the canteen and the usual roles played out by mothers in the past. We have a number of females on club committees and the growing respect of women and their roles is becoming more and more evident. My biggest hope though is that we soon see a female move from club level to join the NFL Board; I assure you that once they get there they will be made to feel very welcome.

You, the stakeholders, have made the Northern Football League one of Victoria's absolute success stories. I congratulate you and urge you to maintain the strength of commitment that has been displayed since the League's inception.

Aim to have sufficient quality grounds and facilities to meet current and future needs of a growing Northern Football League

One of my biggest regrets for the year is that we are still yet to find a new home for the NFL. We have been in discussion with both the City of Banyule and the City of Darebin and we will continue to fight the good fight on the League's behalf. As you would understand it is very difficult finding funds to develop a site that will predominantly be the home of one sport.

We are very fortunate that our relationship with our local governments is terrific; sure we have our moments but we have no doubt that they, the Councils, always act in what they believe is in the best interest of the participants.

This season was the wettest on record for a long time and while we had some grounds that were below par, most were still playable. There were some highlighted deficiencies during the year and the management is working with councils to ensure we are well represented in discussing council issues.

If you are having a problem with your council and would like to have the League assist please ensure you keep us up to date with your issues. The office is in regular contact with the councils and this channel of communication should be utilised.

The opposite should also apply in that we should ensure we do not try to turn the council forum into a place of war. There have been times where we have been informed of one or more of our clubs trying to hijack council meetings for their own benefit; this is not acceptable. Please keep us informed so that we can help you help yourself.

To attract, recruit, retain and develop quality people at all levels in the Northern Football League

Probably 95% of our people are volunteers working for either the love of the sport or to provide a club where they and their family and friends have a quality experience. Whatever your reason for getting involved, we thank you for we are a much better organisation because of your involvement.

Ash Brown has been a valued member of the Northern Region team managed by Phiv Demetriou. He recently departed our home to advance his career taking up a position at the Essendon Football Club. Whether it was performing his duties or simply 'competing' in answering the Herald Sun quiz, Ash has always remained a quality member of the team. We thank him and wish him well.

While it is disappointing to lose such a quality bloke, I have every confidence that his replacement will do very well as the system put in place by Phiv will ensure the transition happens smoothly.

The NFL is now getting a good feel for what it takes to run a successful league and it is because of that that you can expect us to continue to provide the leadership you require in putting together our team. Whether it be contractors, staff, or volunteers throughout the League, I believe we are currently surrounding ourselves with people who will continue to represent the League's Mission Statement and Values.

Speaking of quality NFL people, it was a pleasure to see NFL Ambassador Brent Harvey bring up his 300th AFL game in 2010 - fittingly all for North Melbourne. Not to be outdone, Sharelle McMahon led the Australian Diamonds to a Commonwealth Games silver medal in a thrilling final against the Kiwis.

Chief Executive Officer Report

Fair Game - Respect Matters.

In 2008, the Northern Football League partnered AFL Victoria to roll out to our clubs AFL Victoria's Fair Game - Respect Matters program. The men and women involved in Fair Game - Respect Matters in the Northern Football League work towards creating more vibrant, family friendly, and most importantly, inclusive clubs that value and demonstrate respect for all members.

The aim was to introduce culture change in community football clubs as a way to prevent violence against women. Violence against women can take many different forms: from bullying and harassment through to rape and physical assault. Over the last three years, Fair Game - Respect Matters addressed these issues.

The Northern Football League promotes respectful environments. A Fair Game - Respect Matters club is one in which everyone:

- Feels safe and included
- Acts responsibly on and off the field by refusing to engage in sexist, homophobic or racist behaviour.
- Understands that sexism, bullying, or abusive behaviour is unacceptable under any circumstances.
- Values women's involvement and promotes their participation in all roles.
- Supports men as they work as champions of violence prevention.
- Understands that drunken behaviour makes people feel uncomfortable and can be intimidating.
- Values and promotes good sporting behaviour on and off the field.

The impact of Fair Game – Respect Matters has been significant. Clubs have worked hard in creating a more family friendly environment and as a result we have seen an enormous increase in female participation within our clubs.

Since the program's launch in 2008 we have witnessed some significant changes:

- In 2008, the NFL introduced a women's netball competition which started as a competition consisting of 1 division of 8 teams. In 2010 we fielded 26 teams in 3 divisions, and the expectation for 2011 is 4 divisions.
- Youth Girls' Football Competition to start in 2011.
- Female participation on club committees and office bearers has grown significantly – in 2010 we had 4 female club presidents.

I would like to thank the club "Drivers" of Fair Game

— Respect Matters. Your commitment to and belief in the

Northern Football League's Education Program

January 17th 2010 was a tragic day when five young lives were lost and a 15 year old girl seriously injured in a horrific single car crash on Plenty Road, Mill Park. The driver had a blood alcohol level of 0.19.

The devastation of this accident was felt throughout the community of the northern suburbs and became my motivation to create an education program that could be delivered to clubs within our league. The aim was to heighten awareness of the dangers of drink driving, drugs, and speed in a motor vehicle.

Our determination to deliver this program was strengthened when on March 29, 2010 an 18 year old male driver died after his car left the road and hit a tree just 100 meters from the scene of the previous accident.

Impact Football Solutions' Peter Gilson and Rick Irwin came on board with the Northern Football League, and in conjunction with Phiv Demetriou, constructed a program that was confronting and factual.

The program tackled the issues of drink driving, drugs, speed in a motor vehicle and the importance of an inclusive club environment. The discussion of these issues was lead by Mr Gilson, using overheads and videos, and providing visualisation to the discussion within the club environment. The program also included input from current and ex-AFL players speaking of their personal experiences and observations with regard to the social issues. AFL Players who participated included: Gary Ayres, Marc Murphy, Shaun Higgins, Lindsay Gilbee, Peter Daicos, Dale Weightman, Paul Hudson, Brent Stanton and Colin Kinnear.

The program was conducted by 32 clubs with over 3000 players from Under 15 through to Seniors, and it had a remarkably positive impact. The testimonials received from the clubs detailed observations of a positive change in attitudes of players, and during the presentation you could hear a pin drop, such was the interest from the audience.

As we all know, it is very difficult to survive financially without the support of sponsorships, and again this year we were very fortunate to have on board major sponsors of the NFL: Hot Sublimation (Hot Sublimation has again been appointed the NFL exclusive on-field apparel supplier for the next 3 years), The Bank of Cyprus and Action Alliance. I would also like to thank our business partners; Pisces Food, Victor Sports, Sherrin, Red Onion, Coca Cola, Boags and A-Grade Supplies.

The Northern Football League Juniors has grown substantially since 2007. We fielded an extra 47 teams this year compared to the number fielded in 2007, and this is expected to grow again in 2011 with the likely addition of two new junior clubs. Laurimar Thunder and Bundoora Park Thunderbolts are both new start up junior clubs and have applied to join the Northern Football League for the 2011 season.

I would like to thank the Northern Football League Board for their continued commitment and foresight. As you may have heard, it is unfortunate that our Chairman Ron Bongetti has decided to retire from our Board at this year's Annual General Meeting. Ron has not only been an excellent Board representative and Chairman, but also a magnificent mentor to me and the NFL staff. So on behalf of the Northern Football League community, thankyou Ron for your magnificent contribution to our League.

The AFL Victoria Community Development team in Phiv Demetriou and Ash Brown have done a terrific job in delivering programs that are supporting the continued growth of the Northern Football League.



Football Operations Report

Congratulations to all clubs and members on yet another fantastic year in the Northern Football League. The amount of hard work that is being done by the limitless amount of volunteers behind the scenes is quickly making your league one of the most outstanding community sporting associations in the state. The increasing level of professionalism from all clubs is forcing the continual growth and development of the entire league.

The Senior Finals series was one for the ages. In Division One we saw two teams go back to back, Bundoora in B Grade and Greensborough in C Grade, with West Preston providing an enormous upset in the main game to prevent Heidelberg from recording their fifth straight premiership. Whittlesea have gone from bridesmaids in 2009 to Division One in 2011 with a hard fought win over a determined Lower Plenty: a truly remarkable journey when you consider the devastation that faced their community in February last year. Hurstbridge handled the slop better than Parkside in their Division Three A Grade Grand Final and their victory sees them become the first team in our history to be promoted from Division Three to Division Two. We saw two significant upsets in the Division Two and Three B Grade competitions, with Mernda and South Morana staging courageous single figure victories, while Diamond Creek went through the entire year undefeated on their way to a Division Two C Grade premiership. For the second consecutive year we did not see any club with multiple premiers in the senior divisions!

Another 'for the second consecutive year' statistic saw EVERY junior club represented in the 2010 Junior Finals Series. You know your Junior competition is traveling along nicely when the Prime Minister decides to pop in to a Grand Final; the Honorable Julia Gillard headed north to check out the action at Diamond Creek and provided a wonderful highlight for Under 13 Blue premiers Research when she presented them with their premiership medallions.

Our grading procedures continue to tighten and we have come a long way in only three seasons. The NFL has •

gone from having the highest average winning margin to one of the absolute lowest and we fully intend on becoming the benchmark for other competitions in the next year or two.

The Junior Development Program was upgraded again in 2010, with our Under 12 age group playing competitive matches against an opposing league for the first time. The results during the Metro Champs weren't as fantastic as we might have hoped, but the competitiveness of all four teams was second to none. with the NFL always looking a chance to win. The program isn't about immediate results though, and we hope that the benefits will show in the next few years for the players involved. We will be scaling back the intensity of the program for the Under 14s and Under 15s slightly in 2011 after feedback received from our iunior clubs. An enormous and unreserved thank you to everyone who assisted with the 2010 program, from the coaches, team managers, trainers and water boys, to the clubs who opened their doors for training, meetings and matches. The kids are very lucky to have so many great people supporting them.

Importantly, we managed to form an aliance with St Monica's College in Epping. This gave us full access to their state of the art training facilities and also allowed us to hold our Junior Season Launch and Junior Development Program Jumper Presentation at the venue. Thanks to Ben Shelton, the Director of Australian Football, and the rest of the team at St Monica's for their co-operation.

In 2010 the Northern Football League had an astonishing 6 players represent Vic Metro in the National Under 16 Championships. This is an achievement that cannot be underestimated and you should keep a close eye on the following boys in the coming years:

- Ben Irving (West Preston)
- Brandon Lee (Research)
- Matthew Haynes (Yarrambat)
- Nathan Hrovat (Mill Park)
- Nick Vlastuin (Eltham)

An even further special mention to Nick Vlastuin and Matthew Haynes who have both gained Australian Institute of Sport AFL Scholarships for 2010 / 2011. Watch this space!!

Massive congratulations also to Josh Caddy (Eltham),
Darcy Barden (Research), Glenn Grgic (Epping),
Stephen Witkowski (Diamond Creek) and Josh
Marchbank (Eltham) who were selected in the Vic Metro
Squad for the Under 18 National Championships.
Josh Caddy, who made the All-Australian team
following an outstanding carnival, heads to the Gold
Coast Suns after being selected as the 7th pick overall in
the National Draft. Also a top 10 pick and joining him at
the Suns is former West Lalor junior Dion Prestia. Might
be time to start learning the words to the Gold Coast's
theme song!

While we're congratulating people, I must mention two superb servants of the NFL. Brent Harvey, NFL Ambassador, notched up his 300th AFL match during the year and you could not find a better example of a professional footballer. If you judge a man by the respect he garners from his peers, then Boomer is second to none. A man of equal stature in that regard is Simon Prestigiacomo, who retired with as much class as anyone in the game. Presti, who has our NFL Under 15 Best and Fairest's named after him, is as honest, reliable and fair off the field as he is on it.

The NFL is continuing to grow in its reputation across the state for all the right reasons. In 2011, pending their acceptance at our AGM, we will see two brand new Junior Clubs join the ranks; Bundoora Park Thunderbolts and Laurimar Thunder. Senior clubs are also finding it easier to attract high profile recruits and a lot of this is due to the sanitising of the on-field action. Kevin Smith and his young umpiring group continue to develop and the rise in numbers and quality of umpires cannot be underestimated. The NFL Independent Tribunal has also played a significant role in making your league a 'good news' league. A very special thank you to Mr

Wally Tyrell, who has stood down as one of our Tribunal Chairmen after a career that has spanned well over two decades.

Thank you once again to the team in at NFL House. Delwyn and Josh both invest an enormous amount of time and energy into the league and the results are obvious when looking at the growth of the Netball Competition and the ongoing development of our media department, to mention only two. Kevin, Ron and the Board have provided wonderful leadership and continue to lead the way with innovation and control. Thank you to Ron, who steps down as Chairman this year, for your advice and tutelage. Thanks also to Dean Philpots and the Junior Committee for their work during 2010. Once again it's been a privilege to work so closely with Phiv and Ash from AFL Victoria who have provided support and counsel to many of our clubs. To our Northern friends- the Bullants and the Knights- congratulations on successful seasons; it's terrific to see the region so strongly represented in the VFL and TAC Cup.

As always I'll save the best for last with a gigantic thank you to all the volunteers; you are the lifeblood of community sport and without you there simply wouldn't be a Northern Football League.

We here at NFL House are forever grateful to all the Presidents, canteen managers, timekeepers, secretaries, treasurers, team managers, water carriers, trainers, bar attendants, runners, and all the other jobs too numerous to mention! The one thing that I love most about this job is seeing the amount of passion that people have for their club and their team. I can assure you that we are just as passionate in here about your league and we plan on making the NFL even greater in 2011.

The finals performance was quite outstanding and the most efficient of the three year period I have been here, and the group is showing continual improvement. The league decided the three umpire system for both field and boundary umpires would be used in all A Grade finals across the three divisions. This allowed more umpires to take part in not only finals matches but also in A Grade Grand Finals, which was a real boost to the group and assisted in the good conduct of matches which was obvious to all those in attendance. This allowed for a better standard of football for both participants and spectators alike. The Under 19 finals continued to provide opportunity for those umpires in the formative years of their umpiring.

Whilst it was possible in 2009 to fully service field umpiring requirements, there were weeks when not all boundary and goal umpire appointments were filled. In 2010, due to the continuing progression of the list numerically, we were able to make appointments to all matches no matter what the discipline required. The recruiting of 26 additional goal umpires really helped both the group and the league in presenting its football.

In the 2010 season, 40 field umpires umpired in A Grade (24 appointments available each week), this compared to 33 in 2009. Of the 40 field umpires, 17 were under 24 years of age, and overall a total of 27 of them were under 35 years of age.

Overall there were 92 umpires recruited across all disciplines, and 73 did not return from 2009. The challenge again in 2011 will be to try and retain as many young Sunday field and Saturday boundary umpires as possible and this is not easy given that a lot leave due to study, commencing work, moving away, playing football, loss of interest and, on occasions, the environment they encounter at matches.

The expansive local schools program, which addresses assemblies and smaller groups of students with recruiting in mind, continued in 2010 and proved productive. The delivering of the Basic Umpiring Course in a number of schools also continued successfully, while the Umpire Academy at Mill Park Secondary College continued throughout the season, but for such a large local student population numbers were not as big as expected.

Coaching of each discipline at umpire meetings continued to focus on covering each of the basics needed for good umpiring. Individual coaching was based on observations at matches and took place either on the day or at training, and the improvement of so many umpires has shown this to have been both relevant and effective.

I would like to thank George Smith (Fitness Coach),
Darren Agnew (Juniors Umpire Coach), Shane Herbert
(Goal Umpire Coach) and Doug Armstrong (Boundary
Umpire Coach) who worked so diligently and successfully
throughout the season. A big thanks also to Brian Moore
(Secretary of the Coaching Panel) who worked across all
disciplines to assist the smooth running of umpiring.



To these, along with all those who supported each of the coaches and those who carried out observations and mentoring, your magnificent efforts were appreciated and resulted in many umpires having a feeling of being supported and showing a significant improvement.


Each of the NFL administration team led by Kevin Crompton were always available to discuss umpiring matters and readily tendered new ideas for discussion – always offering and giving assistance when asked or it was appropriate to do so. Each of the staff contributed to umpiring in some way on a regular basis and I always felt the support was there and I am thankful for this. Jarrad Carey in particular worked closely with myself and communicated certain umpiring matters to clubs when that was required. Delwyn Berry was involved in umpiring on general administration matters, and Josh Berriman made himself available to me when I needed his assistance. It is true to say the League Board always showed support for, and interest in, umpiring too.

Expanding umpiring to the three umpire system where appropriate, providing the cost of the Green Shirt uniform for new field umpires, and the funding of the groups' centrally located and appropriate umpire training facility, all have contributed to the increased numbers, expanded coaching and good umpire performance over the last three years.

Tony Mahoney took over as the Umpires Association President and the Association supported both myself and the umpiring group by doing whatever it could to assist in providing an appropriate umpiring environment. Among other things, it arranged for the provision of meals and refreshments after training, arranged regular BBQ's, and both the Junior and Senior Presentation Night were a big success. It is now moving to provide umpires with qualified injury advice on training nights. Arranging an experienced umpire as an Advocate for umpires attending the Tribunal was an important role it performed in 2010 and I want to thank the Association for its efforts throughout the season.

I want to congratulate all those umpires who received a finals appointment of any kind, especially a Grand Final appointment, as you will have deserved it. I want to especially congratulate those umpires who umpired the Division One A Grade Grand Final in such an efficient manner, field umpires Steve Williams, Campbell McPherson and Daniel Compton, boundary umpires Josh Forner, Jeff Miller and Lawrence Coop, and goal umpires Neville Coutts and Matt Lafite.







Junior Chairman's Report

The 2010 season saw the Junior competition grow again in the number of teams competing in the competition. This season we fielded just over 200 sides in the under age competition and this has occurred due to all the hard work officials are doing within their football club's sporting communities.

The junior development program in 2010 has continued to develop along our plan with teams at the Under 13, 14, 15 and 16 age groups. Already with the Junior clubs' backing it appears that we will have an Under 17 representative side next year. This should strengthen our development program and the pathway in our league to ensure players get the best opportunity to play at their highest level and continue to play football beyond their junior age.

This year we also managed to ensure all our coaches were accredited at Level One and this was achieved with a great deal of effort from the AFL Victoria Northern Region Community Development Manager Phiv Demetriou.

In 2010 we also saw some Junior clubs and Auskick centres merge under the one banner and this has provided a great opportunity for players and families to move from the Auskick program to the competitive football arena. Ash Brown has worked hard to ensure that the Auskick program continues to grow within our northern region.

The work of the Auskick co-ordinators and the Junior clubs has led to an increase in numbers at the Under 9 level in 2010 - we had over 600 registered players, with 25% of these players less than 8 years of age. Our next challenge as a league must be to ensure all players, parents, officials and clubs are fully equipped to continuously manage this growth in 2011 and beyond.

Each year, due to the efforts of the NFL umpires and Director of Umpiring, Kevin Smith, our umpiring numbers are growing and we are starting to see improvement in the quality of our junior umpires.

This season saw us have our Under 16 division off and running, and while we only had 6 sides finish the season, it is the start for a new age group and it is expected that this will grow in the next few years.

I would like to thank everyone involved in the Junior competition at club level and the volunteers who are doing great thing in the Junior Development program. I would also like to thank the Junior Committee, and a special mention to Jarrad Carey, the NFL Football Operations Manager who spends many, many hours working to improve the whole junior competition.

It's the anticipation of what they do on Saturday that makes all the Monday-to-Friday work bearable.



The 2010 Premiers

Division 1 Seniors - West Preston - Lakeside

After five wins and an eighth place finish in 2009, West Preston-Lakeside could have been in line for a relegation scrap in 2010. Instead, the club recruited heavily over the summer months and were one of the major players in Division 1 from the beginning of the season all the way through to the Grand Final.

There was one thing missing from the Roosters' 2010 CV going into the Grand Final at Preston City Oval on September 18 - a win against their opponents Heidelberg.

The two teams had met three times leading up to the Division 1 Grand Final, with Heidelberg having won on each occasion - by 49 points in Round 7, 109 points in Round 16, and 88 points in the 2nd Semi Final. In the Round 16 and 2nd Semi encounters, Heidelberg had held West Preston to an aggregate of just six goals from 14 scoring shots, while they had combined for 36 goals from their 61 scoring shots.

Whichever way you looked at it, Heidelberg went into the game as heavy favourites for an unprecedented fifth straight Division 1 senior premiership.

For the first half of the game, Heidelberg looked the better side and held a 17 point lead at half-time. However, they did suffer early, game-ending injuries to Anthony Franchina and Sean Logie, which would hamper their rotations off the bench in the second half.

From that point on, it was all West Preston as they worked the ball all over the park and used their fresh legs to overrun Heidelberg.

The Roosters kicked six goal to the Tigers' one in the third quarter and turned the game in their favour, before an even final term saw West Preston claim their first Division 1 Senior premiership since 2003 by 21 points.

West Preston's Jake Williams was named as the best player on the ground and in a nice touch, was awarded his winner's medal by his father, dual Brownlow Medalist Greg Williams.

As had been the case for the majority of the Roosters' year, Glenn Robertson finished as the team's leading goal kicker of the day with three goals.

The Roosters were unable to make it a Division 1 premiership double after their Reserves team fell just short of Bundoora after a last quarter fightback.

The Bulls were the form team of the competition in 2010 and made it back-to-back premierships with a seven point victory. Bundoora's Matthew Penn was awarded the being best on ground medal.

In the Under 19s, Greensborough also repeated as they came from behind in the last quarter to beat Montmorency by 10 points. Greensborough's Christopher Clark was awarded the best on ground medal.

Division 2 Seniors - Whittlesea

After being in the mix for so long, 2010 was the year where Whittlesea finally took the next step and became the Division 2 premiers.

The Eagles stamped their mark on the season with an emphatic last quarter in Round 1, kicking 12 goals to Mernda's nil and turning a 20 point three-quarter-time lead into a 107 point percentage booster.

From that point on Whittlesea were the team to beat in Division 2, and they rounded the halfway point of the home and away season undefeated, with a two game lead at the top of the ladder, and with an average winning margin of 84 points.

Although they eventually lost three of their final nine regular season games, Whittlesea went into the Grand Final against a resurgent Lower Plenty as the clear favourites, having only lost to the Bears once in their four 2010 encounters.

The Bears finished sixth in 2009 but did not slip below third place for the entire 2010 season, and entered the Grand Final full of confidence after a thrilling one point win over Diamond Creek in the Preliminary Final.

In contrast to their one goal to 10 opening term in the 2009 decider, Whittlesea got out of the blocks strongly this time around and went to the first break with a 21 point lead on the back of some calm finishing from their leading goalkicker Andrew Fairchild.

Lower Plenty came back into the game in the second term and hung in with the Eagles for the remainder of the afternoon, but they could never bridge the gap that Whittlesea built earlier in the game.

In the end it was the 14 more behinds that Whittlesea kicked in the game that was the difference between the two teams at the final siren.

Lower Plenty did themselves proud on the biggest stage and will take heart from Whittlesea being in their exact position just 12 months earlier, while Division 1 beckons for the Eagles in 2011.

Lucas Hobbs was named as the best player on the ground for a performance that produced two classy goals for the premiers as well as a swag of clutch possessions and hard-ball-gets.

Mernda finished premiers in the Reserves on the back of an amazing second-half comeback that saw them erase a seven goal Diamond Creek lead and finish a solitary point in front at the final siren.

Beau Lowry won the best on ground medal finishing with six of Mernda's 10 goals and kept them in the contest in the first half.

There were no such problem for Diamond Creek in the Under 19s were they led from start to finish to win by 34 points in an entertaining game against Lower Plenty. The Demons' Justin Summers was named as best on ground.




Josh Saw was awarded the medal for best on ground with a two goal performance of the half-forward line for Hurstbridge.

- Inclusive club initiatives for women & girls
- Respect Matters is about changing violence supportive attitudes at all levels of the AFL – elite players and coaches, AFL Victoria, the NFL and community clubs are all included.
- Women don't want to change footy, they love it (research, numbers and participation tell us that)
- They do want to feel safe, included and respected as equal participants in the roles they choose to play (both on and off the field).
- Families want their children to enjoy footy and not be bullied (or they vote with their feet).
- Pride itself on Family Club have a number of women involved with the club

Peta is an accredited Level Two coach who has been involved in the VWFL for over 17 years as a player and coach. She is a great communicator, well organised and innovative in her coaching. During the off season she conducted player interviews to ascertain the individual skill needs. This then formed a major part of preseason training to ensure players developed and were afforded the best opportunity to achieve their goals. Peta has created a friendly and positive learning environment for the sauad.

AFCA Victoria President Stan Alves presented a Lifetime Achievement to Community Coaching Award which acknowledged Keith Burns, from the Northern Region, contribution to coaching and coach education in Victoria.

Some of Keith's achievements include coaching 785 game over a period of 38 years, at a number of levels including Victorian Primary School teams, community clubs in the Diamond Valley Football League, Collingwood Under 19s and Northern Knights Under 18s. In the area of coach education Keith has presented and coordinated courses for 1000's of community coaches, primary and secondary teachers and tertiary students.

Social Responsibility Education Program

In 2010 the Northern Football League (NFL), in conjunction with AFL Victoria's support and Victoria Police initiated an Education Program on Social Responsibility to players of NFL Clubs at the Under 15 to 17 and Senior levels. By mid August, over 3,000 players had been educated on the topics outlined below:

- · Effects of Bullying
- · Drugs and Alcohol
- Binge Drinking
- Violence domestic and public
- Depression
- Drink Driving
- Enjoying environments that are for all no matter the culture, gender or level of person
- The importance and inclusion of women in football clubs

Congratulations to all clubs that undertook the Education Nights. The nights have proven to be very successful with the presentations being of a high quality and delivered in a very professional manner. The messages delivered by Impact Football Solutions, namely Peter Gillson and Rick Irwin, plus the AFL Players, etc. have been very powerful, meaningful and reality. The feedback from clubs has been outstanding as a result of the nights.

Below is a snapshot of the Program thus far:

- 32 Clubs have completed the Program thus far 17
 Senior , 15 Junior. This includes the leadership group and Captains and Coaches of all teams.
- Around 3000 players, not including parents, at Junior Clubs and Committee members have attended – this figure would be over 3600 people, including everyone who has had exposure to the program
- Staff and students from St Helena Secondary College were also in attendance in conjunction with

- the Greensborough FC, which was held at St Helena Secondary College on Wednesday, July 28
- Players who have appeared and delivered presentations and powerful messages have included, Gary Ayres, Shaun Higgins, Marc Murphy, Lindsay Gilbee, Dale Weightman, Paul Hudson, Col Kinnear, Brent Stanton, Peter Daicos (used the Championship Moves example relaying the Darren Millane story to West Preston Lakeside FC) – a mixture of old, present, Assistant AFL Coaches, Ex-AFL Coaches; they have all made comments about the Championship Moves vision, re: saving a mate
- Program delivered by Impact Football Solutions' Peter Gillson and Rick Irwin has been brilliant in conjunction with the players. They have heavily promoted Championship Moves
- Clubs have promoted it in their notes section of the Football Record eg. Parkside FC
- Partnership and assistance from the Victoria Police, who have also witnessed and are supportive of Championship Moves. They were in attendance at St Helena.
- As well as Championship Moves, other topics in the presentation have included Drugs and Alcohol, Binge Drinking, Drink Driving, Importance and inclusion of Women in Football Clubs, with vision covered and statistics provided

The Education Program not only targeted 18-24 year olds, but promoted the AFL Victoria brand, AFL Coaches Association, and the Victorian Government in sending key messages of "real champions anticipate trouble, avoid confrontation, and help make sure their mates do too" to under 15-17 year olds and all players on Senior lists. The message was also relayed to youth girls teams who have an association with NFL teams (Lalor Stars, Keon Park and Diamond Creek)







Communities Working Together

The Northern Football League held a Charity Round in Round 8 with a much anticipated match between Greensborough and Bundoora the centrepiece of the round.

The two clubs came together for a fundraising day for the McGrath Foundation and their continuing work towards breast cancer awareness.

As well as three senior games of football, the day featured auctions, raffles, signed memorabilia, and other fundraising activities.

A pink Sherrin was used as the match ball in all games, with Greensborough even parting ways with their traditional green strip for the first time in over 105 years, with a white and pink jumper worn on the day.

The day was a massive success with over \$10,000 raised at War Memorial Park, and Greensborough Vice-President Russell Grubb believes that the football club environment was pivotal to the importance of the event.

"Whether it's us here at Greensborough, or Bundoora, or any of the other NFL clubs throughout all the divisions, we're a pretty important part of a lot of people's lives on a day-to-day basis – the Charity Day was just another extension of it," said Mr Grubb

Elsewhere around the league, the Mill Park Football Club held a Charity Day on Sunday May 30 at Redleap Reserve in support of the White Ribbon Foundation of Australia.

The White Ribbon Foundation of Australia aims to eliminate violence against women by promoting culture-change around the issue.

"With our clubs' recent involvement with the Fair Game Respect Matters program, we felt that a charity involving women would be a great charity to get involved with and violence against women is still a massive issue in our community," said organiser of Mill Park's Charity Day, Jackie Aquilina.

The Northern Umpires Association supported their local Salvation Army Branch coinciding with the start of the Salvo's 2010 Red Shield Appeal.

While Round 9 saw both North Heidelberg and Lalor face each other for the inaugural Hancock/Morrison Cancer Cup.

Over the last three seasons, both clubs have united to help each other raise funds for Scott Morrison and young Aiden Hancock, who have both had their separate battles with cancer.

The Northern Football League helped to raise the profile of the White Ribbon Campaign and Prostate Cancer Awareness by having both logos painted onto the turf of Preston City Oval for the Division 1 and 2 Grand Final days. This was done in conjunction with the Darebin and Banyule councils.

To launch the previously mentioned Social Responsibility program, the NFL held a luncheon attended by among others, Andrew Demetriou (AFL CEO), Peter Schwab (AFL Victoria CEO), and Danielle Green MP (State Member for Yan Yean). The League was lucky to have Ms Green contribute towards the program, while Mr Demetriou gave an intimate speech on the role of local football in the community - opposite is an extract from the speech.



Andrew Demetriou - AFL CEO

Can I start by acknowledging the Northern Football League and thank them for inviting me to come and speak today.

Coming out here to Ivanhoe is a nice reminder of what community football is all about. Because it's out here in the suburbs and in the regions around Victoria that our game is played and enjoyed by thousands of people each week.

Indeed, football and sport in general is the lifeblood of many of these communities. Life revolves around the local footy club, the local cricket club or netball club, whether it be at senior or junior level.

On a Saturday afternoon, football brings people together. It gives them a chance to put the hassles of their daily lives aside for a few hours and enjoy something they love. Something they are passionate about.

They could be players, officials, volunteers or spectators. Mums, Dads, kids, men and women of all ages and backgrounds come together to form their own little communities and celebrate all that's good about them.

Football is not just about what happens at the MCG on a Saturday afternoon. It's also about what happens at the local footy ground, be it in Ivanhoe, Diamond Creek, Balwyn or Bendigo. For me growing up it was Coburg and Pascoe Vale

Community football is still a big part of the Demetriou family. As some of you know, my brother Phiv works as a community development manager in the Northern Region.

I can assure you Phiv is quick to let me know if he ever thinks I might be losing touch with the grassroots of the game. I guess there's nothing like an older brother to bring you into line.

But there's a lot to love about community football and I'm reminded of it whenever I go to game.

It could be the cars parked around the fence, the spectators enjoying a kick on the ground during half time or listening to the coach's speech in the huddle at three quarter time. It could be the volunteers manning the gate or the canteen.

It can sound quaint at times but it's real. It's also important because it's what binds us together as a community. It was no better illustrated than in Kinglake where football helped rally a community in a time of need.

Community and junior football are also where future champions are born. It's why we asked our AFL players to go back to their junior clubs during our 150th anniversary celebrations two years ago.

Because we wanted to pay homage to community football and remind people right across the country of that important connection between the game and their communities. For players to show their appreciation to those who helped them on the way to the elite level.

This year we are negotiating our next broadcast agreement. No doubt many of you have following it in the

newspapers, about how many millions or billions of dollars we're going to get.

But what those obsessed with dollars signs forget is that the money we generate from broadcast rights is re-invested back into the game. It's invested back into our clubs and facilities. To ensure the game remains strong and viable for future generations.

The AFL may be moving into new frontiers in the Gold Coast and Greater Western Sydney but we won't be forgetting the grassroots of the game. We want to invest in community football because we know it's just as important to build at the grassroots as it is at the elite level.

It's why it always disappoints when some people are quick to talk down community football — or any sport for that matter. To focus on the occasional incidents involving spectators or the ugly parents which mar the game from time to time.

Let me be clear here. No incident is ever acceptable. I think we all agree that anything that detracts from the enjoyment of spectators, players and anyone involved with the game can't be tolerated.

That's why we have the Personal Conduct policy to work with clubs to educate, encourage players and officials at our clubs to abide by the community standards of behaviour.

That's why leagues have introduced their own codes of conduct. It's why we have the AFL Kids First Program, to promote good social behavior in junior sport, particularly from parents.

It's why AFL Victoria has the Fair Game: Respect Matters Program to compliment the AFL's Respect and Responsibility program to build welcoming and inclusive environments for

For this I want to also acknowledge Vic Health for their commitment to the program and the work the Northern Football Legaue has done to implement it across their clubs.

As well as its own 'Respect' program, the Northern Football League is also planning to introduce compulsory education sessions for all players aged 15 and over, around social issues such as drugs and alcohol, drink driving, street violence and binge drinking.

I want to acknowledge the President of the Northern
Football League, Ron Bongetti, its CEO Kevin Crompton, and
all those on his team for this initiative, which will be a first for
any league in Victoria.

Thankyou to everyone involved in our game at a community level. To the players, coaches, officials, supporters, sponsors and the thousands of volunteers.

Thankyou for your passion, commitment, good humour and for the countless hours you give of your time so we can all enjoy the game we love and hopefully build a better community for all.


