We entered 2021 full of optimism we would finally get back to playing and we were hopeful we would have an uninterrupted season after all competitions were cancelled in 2020.

It was a delight to all that competition returned with the 2020-21 summer netball season, which involved a record-high 49 teams and seven sections. From a football perspective the Good Friday matches at Eltham and Epping attracted large crowds as spectators enjoyed the first football games in the NFNL since September 2019.

After such a long break, it was great to see so many participants and supporters happy to be back at the football and netball. Unfortunately, as the season progressed the number of COVID cases in Victoria started to increase until eventually the State went into lockdown which instantly paused our season.

Once again, we found ourselves in a position of planning for the unknown. This situation was far more complex than what we went through last year. Planning for multiple scenarios whilst trying to maintain the integrity of all competitions brought great challenges. Among the factors that needed to be considered were the status of promotion and relegation, financial planning – including the impact of playing finals without crowds and how all would be managed operationally should spectators be prohibited at games.

The initial lockdown either side of the Queen's Birthday weekend was brief, and we started again only to be dealt the cruel blow of a further two lockdowns, the second of which continued long enough to leave us with no alternative but to end the season for all competitions. This was extremely disappointing for everyone involved in the NFNL given how much work was put in by so many people across the league.

To navigate through the complexities and to plan for the unknown was extremely difficult. As hard as it was to cancel all football and netball competitions, ultimately the decision was taken out of hands.

I would like to acknowledge the tremendous goodwill demonstrated by our 450 umpires, who for the

second consecutive year supported a pay cut to help keep club costs down. Thank you to each and every one of our umpires for your support of the NFNL and our member clubs. It is greatly appreciated and next year pay rates will be restored.

During another year of financial uncertainty, most of our valued and appreciated partners continued to support the NFNL. The 2021 NFNL football season saw more than 8,700 participants from 37 clubs compete across 47 competitions. A total of 345 football teams took the field, which included continued growth across the girls and women's competitions.

Pleasingly, this season saw great collaboration from all clubs within our junior competitions, with clubs working together to get through the interrupted season and give all kids the best chance to play as many games as possible. This included the presence of one merged team. Credit must go to Yarrambat and Research (Under-17s), who worked together diligently to field a merged team, which provided a great outcome for all involved.

It certainly was fantastic to return to the field this year after not being able to play in 2020. Unfortunately, we weren't able to see out the entire season and, due to Melbourne's extended lockdown, we were unable to proceed with any finals.

The teams who were on top of the ladder were recognised as the minor premiers in all senior competitions and we congratulate them on their achievement. The NFNL Board determined that promotion and relegation would not be applied for all senior men's competitions due to the shortened home and away season and cancellation of the finals.

For all junior competitions from Under-11s and above, the team on top of the ladder was awarded the premiership, with the second-placed team named runner-up. Congratulations to all junior premiers and runners-up on your achievements in 2021. We also commend all other teams for playing with outstanding spirit and sportsmanship despite the tough situation we found ourselves in this year.

The NFNL Junior Representative Program returned, with six teams competing in the 2021 AFL Victoria Metro Junior Development Series. The competition was held during the July school holidays after Covid restrictions forced the postponement of the competition from being held in its usual slot over the Queen's Birthday weekend.



The Under-14 Boys teams led by John Garrard and Adam Sevas, the Under-15 Boys teams coached by Jason McBean and Glen Lehner, and the Under-15 Girls teams headed by Ari Sciacca and Adam Raphael, all had a fantastic series. Players were given the opportunity to experience the next level in football, and all represented the league with distinction on and off the field. We extend a huge thank you to all coaches, assistants, officials, volunteers, parents and players involved in the representative program for being so flexible in allowing the games to be moved to the school holidays. This resulted in the successful running of the competition, which was a major highlight of the year for all involved.

A big thank you must also go to Junior Representative Co-ordinators Rick LeGassick and Lisa Kankaanpaa. Every year Rick and Lisa put in a huge number of hours to facilitate a great program and foster a supportive environment for all to enjoy.

Thank you to NFNL Head of Umpiring Cameron Nash and all his coaching and appointment staff. The cancellation of the 2020 season was felt hard by all clubs, and perhaps more so by the umpiring group. With umpire numbers declining right across the state, it was a great effort by Cameron and his team to ensure most games were supplied with umpires and to maintain a high standard of officiating.

To all NFNL umpires, thank you for your efforts in 2021 and for often officiating more games than you normally would each weekend to assist all competitions.

Umpiring is undoubtedly a very difficult job, however most of the feedback received from clubs was extremely complimentary.

A big thank you must also go to those clubs who provided club umpires this year when numbers were short. It was great to see individuals put their hand up to ensure all games could be facilitated and that players had the best experience possible.

The NFNL has a huge team of volunteers who assist us in managing our organisation. Thank you to the NFNL Board, judiciary members, tribunal advocates, and La Trobe University placement students. Without your assistance we wouldn't be able to provide our clubs with the level of support we do.

Finally, thank you to all club presidents, executive and committee members, coaches, officials, spectators, sponsors and, of course, the players. You are the people who make this such a fantastic league to be involved in. Thank you for your support during a challenging 2021. Have a safe and happy break and we'll see you all again in 2022 for what will hopefully be an uninterrupted season.

Being my first year in the role I wanted to introduce new initiatives to assist in the development, recruitment, and retention of football umpires in the NFNL umpiring program.

It commenced with putting together a new coaching panel, with the majority having recent VFL and AFL experience. This ensured new fresh ideas were introduced to assist in growing the professionalism of the program and creating an even more inclusive environment.

AFL umpires Mat Nicholls and Eleni Glouftsis were appointed AFL ambassadors for the NFNL in February. Mat and Eleni were used to assist in recruitment and coaching. Senior field umpire Lisa Compton-Robins was appointed Female Welfare Officer to assist in growing and developing our female participation numbers. Meanwhile, recently retired AFL umpire Sam Hay was appointed to assist Neville Nash with coaching our talented group of development squad field umpires.

VFL premiership coach Andrew Collins attended training to conduct a very effective team building session in March. Also, in March and May we conducted female 'Come and Try' nights, with eight attendees completing the sessions run by Eleni Glouftsis and Lisa Compton-Robins. These nights were heavily promoted within all NFNL clubs. In late April we had AFL boundary and goal umpires attend training to assist in run coaching and skill drills. In early May, Neville Nash ran Basic Umpire Courses at four club venues to assist clubs who needed to provide umpires for junior matches. We also commenced two new training venues at Eltham and Wallan to assist in recruitment and making it more convenient for umpires to attend training sessions. This will continue in 2022 as we look to provide more accessible ways for new umpires to get involved.

Throughout the year school umpire courses were conducted at Loyola College, Parade College and Viewbank College, with Loyola being the most successful with the number of students transitioning into NFNL umpires.

Field umpire coaching sessions were put online each week for the purpose

of assisting umpires who couldn't attend training and for those that wanted to revisit the session.

Training programs were also put online to provide umpires with a structured physical training program they could complete in their own time. These sessions continued throughout the lockdowns to ensure the umpires had continuity.

Umpire registrations finished at 425 umpires, which was only just short of the 437 tally during the last full season in 2019. The initiatives noted above heavily contributed to the successful increase in numbers throughout the season.

I would like to thank all NFNL clubs for their patience and support as we grew our numbers as the season went on. Many clubs promoted umpire recruitment through their networks, which contributed to the growth in our numbers.

Developing umpires were provided more opportunities in higher levels in 2021, with seven field umpires officiating their first Division 1 senior men's match this year.

To further advance our field umpires, we will be running a Personal Development Program for our development squad field umpires between October and February. The purpose is to assist the umpires manage and develop their umpiring

on and off the field, with the program including session on areas such as training standards, diet and nutrition and mind and performance.

Congratulations to the 2021 umpire award winners, including Luke Richardson (Senior Umpire of the Year), Liam White (Most Improved Senior Umpire), Lachlan Flinn (AFL Victoria Golden Whistle Award), Lisa Compton-Robins (Junior Field Umpire of the Year) and Ryan O'Grady (Most Promising Junior Umpire).

The challenges moving forward are continuing to build on the strong recruitment initiatives from this year, increasing female participation numbers, developing the environment for more females to attend training, growing the satellite training venues at Eltham and Wallan, and developing our current team of umpires to continue to prosper.

I would like to thank all the umpire coaches and support staff, along with the NFNL staff for their support of umpiring.

We look forward to building on the foundations laid this year and taking those into 2022.

The NFNL's netball program expanded in 2021 which allowed returning participants to get back on court following the cancelled 2020 season, as well as providing opportunities for those new to the sport to get involved.

After missing out on the entire 2020 winter season, we were fortunate enough to be able to run our summer competition from November 2020 through to March 2021. It was fantastic to have the action return, albeit in different circumstances with spectators not permitted to attend matches until the easing of Covid restrictions in late February. Thankfully, spectators were able to be in attendance during the finals series, which created a fantastic atmosphere.

Team and section numbers again increased for both the winter and summer seasons, which was again a significant achievement considering the restrictions that had been in place. A record-high 49 teams competed across seven sections in the summer season, while the winter season consisted of 97 teams across 13 sections.

We were delighted to welcome a new club to the netball court this year, with Panton Hill fielding a team in both the summer and winter seasons. Meanwhile, many of our existing clubs expanded their netball program by fielding extra teams throughout the year. The efforts of Bundoora

deserve special mention, with the club fielding a record 10 teams during the winter season, as well as eight during the summer season.

Congratulations to all the 2020-2021 summer season premiers and award winners. It was fantastic to be able to acknowledge the individual award winners, as well as the premiers at the 2020-2021 summer grand final night at La Trobe Sports Stadium.

With the winter season coming to an abrupt finish due to the extended COVID lockdown in Melbourne, the board determined that all sides who finished atop their respective ladders would be recognised as minor premiers. All individual awards were still presented, with this year's awards presentation being conducted online. We congratulate all best and fairest winners, along with the leading goal shooters.

Umpire numbers were negatively impacted, with many umpires not returning to the game following last year's cancelled season. This created unprecedented challenges, with the additional number of games meaning some umpires officiated up to four matches on a Friday night. Whilst not ideal, measures were put in place to increase our umpire numbers.

Lauren Theodosis joined the NFNL netball department in a part-time role and helped establish the league's junior netball program. She was soon elevated to a full-time role to assist with the weekly umpire appointments and co-ordinating umpire development sessions with Umpire Coach Amanda Dale and Umpire Mentor Coach Ann Castles.

We were able to increase our umpire numbers and establish a Netball Umpire Academy, which 10 umpires have already graduated. We have also partnered with La Trobe Sport to assist with umpires for their competitions on Thursday, which will also assist us developing our umpires by providing them more experience.

I would like to pass on my sincere thanks to both Amanda and Ann, as well as venue managers Jake Murphy, Sue Owen, Kim Draper and Lauren Theodosis, who ensured all matches were completed efficiently.

Thanks to our venue assistants Shannon Anderson, Grace Wake, Tamara Pittonet, Julie Lempriere and Tracey Matthews, who manned the venue door each Friday night. Thanks for your administration assistance and attending to the needs of all teams, players and spectators.

I would also like to thank all players, coaches, clubs and umpires for their support and efforts throughout the season. I look forward to seeing you all again in season 2022.

To my colleagues at the NFNL, thank you for your ongoing support of the netball program. A special mention to Lauren Theodosis who has assisted me greatly and shares the same vision of growing participation and striving to make the NFNL the best netball competition in the region.

JUNIOR NETBALL

Junior netball continues to develop in the NFNL through the NetSetGo program, with the number of centres run and participants involved expanding in 2021.

Our NetSetGo centres reached a total of 74 registered participants, across three clinics based out of primary schools in Epping and Donnybrook.

The program's expansion has helped to grow junior netball participation in the region, providing young players the opportunity to develop their

basic netball skills and participate in modified match play. These sessions have prepared young netballers to transition into club-based netball competitions.

With Covid-19 restrictions making face-to-face sessions impossible, we took our clinics online to continue to engage participants in netball during statewide lockdowns. We hosted our first school holiday program, in partnership with AFL Victoria, through online platforms. This allowed us to continue netball

engagement throughout the northern region.

We continue to work with and support our clubs to develop junior netball teams and create club pathways from junior to senior netball.
