Chairman

On behalf of the board of directors of the Northern Football Netball League, I present the League's Annual Report for 2023.



What a terrific year we have had across the NFNL. After a wonderful 2022, we have been able to collectively lift to another level this year. Thank you for all your efforts in making this such a strong community sporting association, one that is the envy of so many others. What inspires me the most is our strong connection to community and the passion displayed by all involved. In both netball and football, the enthusiasm, engagement and enjoyment has been at a very high level. Our community stakeholders play such an integral role in making that happen, and this not only includes the clubs, but also the tireless volunteers, sponsors, coaches, umpires, supporters, league administrators and of course the players.

We are so well positioned to deliver even more for our community, so please continue to be involved and embrace that enthusiasm.

There have been a number of changes this year, none more so than the introduction of our new CEO Martin Stillman, who commenced in January. Martin immediately rolled up his sleeves and got out to clubs to learn more about netball and football in the north including the vibrant, diverse, and positive culture that we provide. He is a people person, but also thinks strategically for the future of our league and leads a very professional and hard-working team. Thank you for your work this year Martin.

We've seen continued expansion across the league, with a steady rise over the last 10 years in the netball competition and a sharp rise in junior netball this year. There is still so much more to come for the future of our netball program so, watch this space. Junior

football has also increased in participation this year and in senior football, we welcomed back Kinglake to the competition, with their senior men's side performing strongly in Division 3, going on to reach the semi-final.

The finals series was exceptional. We had excellent crowds at the junior finals, followed by high quality netball finals culminating with a strong North Heidelberg 1 win in the Section 1 decider. Montmorency, St. Mary's and Wallan won their first premierships in their respective divisions in senior women's football in front of a record crowd of almost 2000 people, which would no doubt be one of the biggest community football crowds in the women's game.

Then came an electric Division 3 men's grand final, with Laurimar clinching their first ever premiership in an absolutely thrilling finish to a pulsating game against Mernda in front of another record crowd - congratulations to both sides. Eltham also got their first senior men's premiership in 21 years with a strong performance by beating minor premiers Diamond Creek in brilliant sunshine and yet another record crowd. Two heavy weights in Heidelberg and Bundoora battled it out for the second year in a row in the Division 1 men's grand final, and in an entertaining game, the Tigers proved too strong and came away with their 21st Division 1 premiership (22 premierships overall). They have truly established themselves as a powerhouse and the benchmark of the competition.

I'd like to also mention Thomastown's Division 3 under 19.5's premiership, after the club fielded an under 19.5's side for the first time in 11 years, as well as Old Eltham

Collegians, who claimed the Division 3 reserves flag to bring silverware to the club for the first time in their NFNL history.

The Turtles also finished as the Senior Club of the Year, while Kilmore were crowned the Junior Club of the Year, and I congratulate both clubs on their efforts in season 2023.

It would be remiss of me not to acknowledge Shane Harvey, who's retirement earlier this year capped off an extraordinary goalkicking career in the NFNL. He leaves the game as one of the most decorated in local football.

Our Football Operations Manager Jeff Downes has been run off his feet throughout the year to allow our Football Department to continue to aid all of our clubs. He was well supported by Callum Griffiths who also continued in game development. It is so often a thankless task for Jeff and Callum as they have to step up when things go wrong, but I've seen how hard they work and want to acknowledge their efforts throughout the year.

Delwyn Berry has been around the NFNL for a long time and continued in the valuable role of Administration and Netball Manager. Delwyn has kept things well managed and structured for us all and is such a wealth of knowledge. She was well supported in the netball program once again by Lauren Theodosios who has driven a rapid expansion in junior netball.

Martin Ellis returned as the Head of Umpiring after a few years away from the organisation. There are so many demands in this challenging job, but Martin has tackled them head on and delivered a continued growth in umpire numbers.

Media Manager Nicholas Sacco has been a revelation in the last two years and really settled into the groove this year. We continue to move with the times and ensure that the high-quality sporting community that we are is represented and reflected positively across all forms of media.

Both Byron Smith as Finance Manager and Joanne Timewell as Finance Officer have worked well with each other and ensured that our finances are well managed in what has been a very strong and positive year financially for the league.

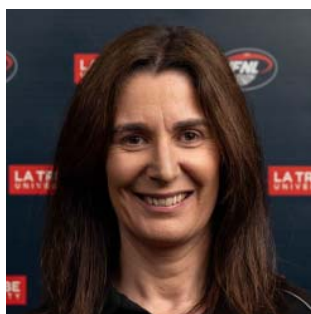
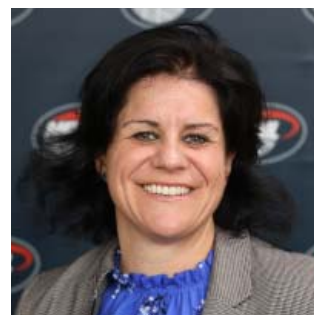
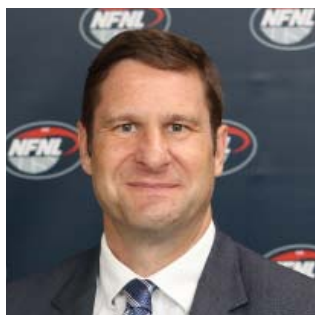
Chelsa Robson. Chelsa quickly caught herself up to speed and brought both passion and desire for broad growth and fairness across the competition in her thinking.

Season 2023 marked a significant milestone for the NFNL, solidifying its position as one of the leading community leagues in Victoria.



Throughout the organisation, the NFNL experienced growth in various pivotal areas, with participation surging across the league, particularly in our junior netball and football programs.

Reflecting on my inaugural season as CEO of the NFNL, I take immense pride in being associated with a league that achieved numerous commendable milestones throughout the year.

I extend my personal gratitude to all affiliated club Presidents who took the time to meet with me early in my tenure. This enabled me to swiftly establish a sense of each club's history, accomplishments, and most importantly, identify areas where the NFNL could lend support to further elevate their standing.

In 2023, the NFNL welcomed back Kinglake, a return that left an indelible mark on Heidelberg Golf Club Division 3. One of the most competitive seasons in recent history culminated with arguably the finest Division 3 grand final the league has produced, as Laurimar clinched the club's first piece of silverware in a come-from-behind victory against Mernda.

In MC Labour Division 2, Eltham had a stellar campaign and succeeded in achieving premiership victory over Diamond Creek. While in Melbourne Greyhounds Division 1, we extend hearty congratulations to Heidelberg for their remarkable back-to-back premiership, securing another flag against Bundoora in the decider.

The women's competition showcased high-quality football, reaffirming the robust appetite for women's football in the North. Congratulations to Heidelberg Golf Club Division 1 premiers Montmorency for their triumph over Banyule, and to Cleaning Melbourne Division 2 premiers St Mary's for their victory over Heidelberg. Wallan emerged victorious in Division 3, completing a brilliant turnaround from the year prior to defeat Darebin for the flag.

Congratulations also to all premiership teams for their success in the 2023 junior football competition, including both boys' and girls' teams.

In netball, the North region hosts year-round competitions, encompassing both Summer and Winter leagues along with a thriving junior competition. Special congratulations go to North Heidelberg 1, who were rewarded for their undefeated regular season with a Section 1 grand final win over North Heidelberg 2.

I extend congratulations to all premiers, from Section 2 to 13 in the senior winter competition, as well as all nine teams who claimed silverware in the senior summer netball competition.

It was fantastic to award premierships to our junior netball sides for the first time in 2023 and I congratulate those sides who will go down in history as our inaugural junior summer and winter netball champions.

Well done to each of our individual award winners for season 2023. Our two best and fairest events were another fantastic opportunity to recognise their outstanding personal achievements. A particular highlight was Lachlan Wilson of Heidelberg, who earned the prestigious title of becoming a dual Rosbrook Medalist at this year's count.

Umpiring saw continued evolution this year, marked by an influx of new umpires, the establishment of an umpire academy, and several other initiatives that elevated the quality of umpiring in the NFNL.

Representative netball and football results this season were gratifying. A more detailed analysis will be provided in the respective netball and football reports, however a heartfelt thanks are extended to all players, officials, and volunteers who made it all possible throughout the year.

To our esteemed commercial partners, listed in the Chairman's report, we express our gratitude for their invaluable contribution to the NFNL. Several organisations have been longstanding supporters of the league, and for those partners we welcomed to the NFNL in 2023, we eagerly anticipate their continued support.

We extend our thanks also to all our valued key stakeholders and partners, including AFL Victoria, Netball Victoria, Carlton Football Club, Northern Bullants, Northern Knights,

and all the councils within our region, as well as our community partners.

I would be remiss not to acknowledge my staff, who provided exceptional support during my inaugural year at the NFNL.

To all staff members, my sincere thanks. Your loyalty, dedication, passion, and commitment to the league are beyond reproach. Your drive and desire to serve the clubs and ensure the NFNL stands as one of the best-run community leagues is unquestionable.

Football Operations

In 2023, the NFNL provided another fantastic year of football across our three senior men's competitions, three senior women's competitions and thirty-seven junior competitions.

The league continues to grow in what is a testament to the structures, processes, and ultimately the volunteers across the NFNL. Over 9,500 players registered for the 2023 campaign, with that number illustrating growth in both junior and senior, as well as men's and women's football.

As a result of the inclusive and supportive environments that our junior clubs have created, we grew to a combined number of 12 Under-9's and Under-10's competitions this year. The growth in junior football will continue to be exponential for years to come, ultimately allowing for greater development and competition in the region.

Meanwhile the senior men's football competition grew again in 2023 with the re-introduction of Kinglake into the NFNL for the first time since 2007.

It was not only a great thrill to see the Lakers back into the competition, but also to see them have an immediate impact. Their 151-point opening round win would foreshadow a terrific campaign for their senior men's side, where they remained in

the top four for the rest of the Heidelberg Golf Club Division 3 home and away season, finishing in third position, before exiting the finals series at the semi-final stage.

Congratulations again to Kinglake for making the move across to the Northern Football Netball League, and we look forward to seeing them develop and compete in our competition for years to come.

In the senior women's competition, we welcomed Heidelberg West and North Heidelberg for the first time, and like Kinglake in the men's, both sides had a strong influence in Division 3. A special mention to Heidelberg West who went on to finish second and reach a preliminary final in their inaugural season.

The NFNL was again represented at junior level by our Under-14 Boys, Under-15 Boys and Under-15 Girls representative squads. A comprehensive change to the NFNL Junior Representative Program occurred in 2023, with a focus on ensuring players will return to their clubs as better footballers both on and off field after their completion of the program.



Changes made to the structure and timelines of the program this year allowed final squads to maximise their training time together for greater cohesiveness and chemistry. We also played practice matches against other leagues in the lead up to the AFL Victoria Metro Junior Development Series (AFL Victoria MJDS) and implemented specialist skills coaches into the overall weekly training program.

The impact of these improvements was reflected in the AFL Victoria MJDS in 2023, in which the NFNL recorded 25% more wins across our teams from the previous year.

A big congratulations to our individual NFNL representative MVP award winners. This year's awards were won by Chas Woodward (Montmorency) - Under 15A Boys, Jack Tranquilli (Eltham) - Under 15B Boys, Grace Farah (Diamond Creek Womens) - Under 15A Girls, Ayva Humphreys (Research) - Under 15B Girls, Jack Schembri (Keon Park) - Under-14A Boys and Kobi Gibson (Greensborough) - Under-14B Boys.

We look forward to reviewing and continuing to find ways to improve the program in 2024 in order to keep providing our elite juniors with an amazing development experience.

We had 25 Air Fusion junior grand finals take place across seven venues on Sunday, August 20, culminating what was another successful finals series. All grand finals were filmed by SportsCast Australia, with sales at an all-time high.

A big thank you to all our junior finals host clubs throughout the week series: Diamond Creek, Eltham, Epping Hurstbridge, Keon Park, Mernda, Mill Park, Research, Wallan and Yarrambat.

The 2023 senior finals series kicked off with our women's competitions, as teams competed again at Whittlesea, Epping and Preston City Oval throughout the series. Our grand finals on Sunday, August 27 were played at a terrific standard, with three more sides making history by winning their club's first flags in the women's competition.

Wallan came out victorious in the Division 3 decider, completing their impressive turnaround from finishing on the bottom of





the ladder in 2022, to losing just one game this year on their way to the premiership. St Mary's and Heidelberg played out a great Division 2 grand final, with the Burra kicking away late to secure the triumph, while Montmorency's brilliant home and away season culminated with the ultimate prize, defeating Banyule in the Division 1 grand final. We thank all 21 teams that competed in the 2023 senior women's competition.

In Heidelberg Golf Club Division 3, Laurimar were successful in claiming silverware after one of the most entertaining finishes to a Grand Final in NFNL history. Old Eltham Collegians, the NFNL Senior Club of the Year, took out the reserves premiership, while Thomastown won the Marbuilt Division 3 Under-19.5 grand final.

In MC Labour Division 2, Eltham and Diamond Creek were the two stand out teams throughout the season and in the final game of the campaign, it was the Panthers who ended a 21-year drought to win the flag. Eltham's reserves also claimed silverware in the reserves competition while Diamond Creek proved too strong to secure the Marbuilt Division 2 Under-19.5 premiership.

The final day on the 2023 NFNL calendar saw our showcase event, the Melbourne Greyhounds Division 1 grand final, played

between Heidelberg and Bundoora for a second straight year at Preston City Oval. Another excellent performance from Heidelberg saw them go back-to-back, winning the decider by 23 points. The Tigers' reserves went one better in 2023 by producing a comprehensive grand final victory, while Greensborough claimed the Marbuilt Division 1 Under-19.5 grand final premiership.

We saw increased crowds at all our senior men's and women's finals this year, highlighting the continued importance that grassroots football has on the local community.

A key objective for the NFNL football operations team in 2023 was to modernise systems and processes to improve performance and efficiencies for all. The introduction of online match paperwork was a resounding success, allowing umpires, following the conclusion of a match, to complete an online form that is instantaneously sent to the presidents and secretaries of competing teams, along with key NFNL staff. Other innovations included easing the burden on finals host venues, introducing online forms for various enquiries, fixtures being complete for the entire grading period as opposed to week by week, and an increase of online forums rather than in-person meetings.

The NFNL will continue to adapt systems, processes, rules & regulations to keep up with an ever-changing and modernising society. The league has held a comprehensive By-Law and season review with all clubs, providing each club with ample opportunity to give feedback and suggestions on how the league can continue to improve for 2024 and beyond.

In closing, thank you to all club presidents, committee members, coaches, officials, and all other game day volunteers. The NFNL brand is strong and very respected in the broader football community, and that's thanks to your tireless work throughout the year.

We look forward to working with you all again in 2024 as we continue to increase professionalism and grow the number of participants in the league.

Football Umpiring

Since coming out of COVID, the NFNL has enjoyed its most successful year in umpire recruitment and development.

We saw 416 umpire registrations in 2023, 17 more than 2022, while female participation was up 1500%.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank every registered umpire who officiated this year, for their contribution and effort to participate in football umpiring and be a part of their community.

The NFNL continues to be the leader in community football across Victoria by providing the highest percentage of umpires to games in relation to competition games sanctioned.

There were significant increases in umpire participation across all three disciplines of umpiring (field, boundary, and goal) and we were able to not only sign up more new umpires, but also appoint them to more games.

Initiatives such as providing a 50% rebate on uniforms for new umpires who officiated in 12 or more games in 2023 (which saw the NFNL pay over \$6,000 in rebates to umpires) are a prime example of our continuous efforts in recruiting umpires.

To assist female recruitment and retention, NFNL Umpire Academies were re-introduced, with the program conducted at Our Lady of Mercy College (OLMC) Heidelberg being our most successful, as it saw six ladies go on to officiate in our senior women's grand finals this year.

We continue to invest in these Academies as schools become more interested in being involved with umpiring.

Umpire development continues to be high on our agenda as we streamline those talented

umpires who are keen to pursue a career in umpiring with advanced coaching supported by AFL Victoria. As a result, we have some exciting new talent who are on that pathway to success and continue to make fantastic inroads into umpiring senior football.

Satellite training venues in Eltham and Wallan were a roaring success as by being able to provide information, direction, coaching and training, we saw a huge increase in attendance. With the NFNL covering a widespread area in Melbourne's north, the ability to service these training venues will remain an important task in 2024 and beyond, and I would like to thank the Eltham and Wallan Junior Football Clubs for allowing us to conduct umpire training at your venues.

Other initiatives such as the three-umpire system created further opportunities for developing umpires to officiate in senior football and proved to be an important factor for the development, progression, and retention of new and younger umpires.

In 2023, we also implemented the four-umpire system during our Division 1 preliminary final week which culminated into grand final week. The process was well received by umpires and clubs, as it resulted in higher decisional accuracy and stronger match management. With thanks to CEO Martin Stillman, the NFNL were the first community-based umpiring group to show leadership, innovation, and progression in this space.

Improvement from one season to another requires energy and enthusiasm and this year I received amazing support from Richard Thwaites (goal umpires coach), Brian

Moore (boundary umpires coach) and Peter James (juniors umpire coach), along with other support staff, Sam Hay, Adrian Pekin, Simon Hubber, Craig Edwards, Michael Blair, Di Herman, Tim Thwaites, Neville Coutts, Jos Winthorst, Paul Panayotides, Alex Langdon, Brett Lynch, Steve Hanley and Ryan O'Grady who all contributed to a successful season.

Their passion and commitment saw the umpiring team reach new heights over the course of the 2023 campaign. I would like to thank them all for all their hard work and I look forward to their continued commitment next year.

The Northern Umpires Association (NUA) and their wonderful team of volunteers, led by retiring President Dan Henery, did a fantastic job by assisting with skills at training and providing food, fun and entertainment for our umpires. Participation in training as well as after-training social gatherings continued to grow under his leadership, and we thank Dan sincerely for his efforts and passion for umpiring over the last 10 years.

I would like to congratulate the 2023 Umpire of the Year award winners in Russell Yin (Field), Marc Botoulas (Boundary), Alan Webb (Goal) and Caleb Turnbull (Juniors) for outstanding seasons in umpiring. It's a fantastic achievement that recognises their commitment to umpiring, their decisional accuracy, their match management, their fitness, and ability to perform their skills consistently at the highest level.

I also want to congratulate all umpires who were appointed to finals and grand finals across our junior and senior competitions this year. We had no multiple grand final umpires, which is a fantastic result for all those who were selected as well as the entire umpiring team.

The NFNL Board, led by Chairman Scott Walker and the entire NFNL team, led by CEO Martin Stillman, with special mention to Football Operations Manager Jeff Downes, have continued to show their support for football umpiring and I thank them for their assistance in 2023.

Finally, a special thank you to all our NFNL clubs. Once again, your support and patience towards our umpiring department has been terrific and I encourage you to continue your fantastic work in the umpiring space to help take the pressure off volunteers and parents.

In 2024 we look forward to another exciting season of community football in which umpires are an essential part of.

Netball

It was a great thrill for the NFNL to see substantial growth across our junior and senior netball competitions in 2023.

We were able to host the first installment of the junior summer netball competition in the 2022-23 season, with age groups expanding from 9&U to also include two 13&U divisions. By welcoming Greensborough, Keon Park Stars, Bundoora, and Heat to the competition, we had a total of 12 teams participate in the season, with over 90 participants taking part. Our 9&U teams completed the season playing a round robin, while Heat claimed the premiership for the 13&U Red division, and Greensborough finished off the perfect season by winning the grand final in the 13&U Blue division.

Our summer campaigns in the senior competition continues to grow substantially. The 2022-23 season developed into a strong competition as 69 teams competed across nine divisions, which was an increase of 53% compared to the 2021-22 season. We would like to congratulate all teams on their premiership success, Montmorency 1 (Section 1), Watsonia 1 (Section 2), Montmorency 2 (Section 3), Heat 5 (Section 4), Thomastown 3 (Section 5), Thomastown 4 (Section 6), Heat 6 (Section 7), Heat 8 (Section 8), Montmorency 5 (Section 9).

Growth would again be the theme in our winter competitions in 2023, beginning with our juniors, as the Fitzroy Stars produced their first junior netball sides into the NFNL. With 22 teams entered across the eight clubs, the competition was able to expand to 9&U, 11&U, and 14&U age groups, with 220 junior players taking the court; illustrating an enormous participation increase of over 500% compared to the previous winter 2022 campaign.

This competition growth saw the need to expand to two venues – Mill Park Stadium, and Banyule Nets Stadium in order to conduct each fixture. We would like to thank Bernadette Huryn for her assistance in venue managing during the season and mentoring our beginner umpires. The 2023 junior netball finals series consisted of 9&U and 11&U teams playing a round robin, before our 14&U division played out in a top 4 finals series. It was Greensborough who would claim their second junior netball premiership with a terrific performance in the grand final.

The 2023 senior winter competition again had a record number of 105 teams competing in 13 divisions. Grading took place

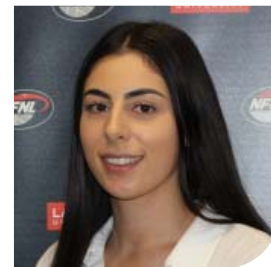
over the opening four rounds to determine the make-up of each section and again helped to ensure that all competitions enjoyed a strong competitive balance on a weekly basis during the regular season.

The league has handed over the NetSetGo programs at Epping, Keon Park, Donnybrook and Hurstbridge to each respective club so it can be managed independently, however the NFNL continues to provide support to these programs, and we thank each club for their commitment to growing junior netball within their community.

The return of representative netball this year saw a 15&U, 17&U and Open team selected to compete in Netball Victoria's Association Championships. This was the first-time representative netball was offered to junior age groups...

Amy Ilic and Shane Purss from the Talent Squad achieved their B badges, which is a wonderful achievement. We send special congratulations to both umpires and extend our gratitude to all the other members of the squad for their passion and commitment to the program. Our congratulations to the

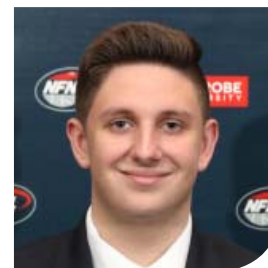

The NFNL continues to grow its online presence, with engagement across our digital platforms higher than ever.



NFNL.org.au was again the centre of all news and information from the league, with the number of visitors to the website continuing to rise by the millions as for the first time, the website reached 5,000,000 page views in a 12-month span.

Meanwhile social media pages continued to play a vital role in allowing the league to engage more closely with our expanding community. Given the large following we have attracted on Facebook and Instagram in 2023, the league has put a concerted effort towards driving as much traffic through these platforms as possible.

As of October 31, the NFNL's online reach included:

- **5,001,253** page views at NFNL.org.au (21% increase since October 31, 2022)
- **21,153** Facebook followers (7% increase)
- **14,065** TeamApp members (2% increase)
- **11,813** Instagram followers (15% increase)
- **3,807** Twitter followers (3% increase)

Our strong partnership with Sportscast Australia was a major catalyst behind our impressive digital growth in 2023. Again, every senior men's match and all senior women's finals were filmed, with replays and highlights packages published online at a rapid pace.

With short form video and reels becoming the most consumed content in today's world, the NFNL teamed up with Sportscast Australia at the start of the season to help produce 'snackable' reels throughout this year's campaign with terrific success.

The want for this easily digestible content was highlighted in June, when a 24 second clip of Eltham's Cameron Sullivan performing a courageous act that led to a goal for his side was viewed by nearly 200,000 people on Instagram and received over 5,000 likes to become the most engaged post on any NFNL platform.

Overall, video content created by the NFNL or Sportscast Australia on the NFNL's Instagram page garnered nearly 750,000 views this year.

Every senior grand final was live streamed as well as both our senior and junior best and fairest evenings. The Melbourne Greyhounds Division 1 grand final live stream was the highest standard of production of any NFNL event, with six cameras filming the game to ensure all angles were covered. Pre-match entertainment, highlights packages and behind the scenes vision were all included in the final production, with feedback from consumers and stakeholders positive.

I am incredibly grateful to Andrew and Matt McLeish as well as their entire term at Sportscast Australia for delivering quality content each and every week. We simply would not have been able to produce the numbers previously mentioned without their tireless work and I look forward to creating even more dynamic content together in 2024.

While keeping up with all our competitions continues to be a challenge for the media department, a strong media team was assembled for season 2023 and were able to produce regular coverage of all our senior football and netball competitions, as well as this year's junior football season. The work to achieve this feat by our media volunteers has been incredible, as they helped ensure fans were kept up to date with all the latest news from around the league. To have such a committed team at my disposal is one I don't take for granted and I am grateful for their efforts this season.

The NFNL Match of the Day continued in 2023 and was again aired on 88.6 Plenty Valley FM every weekend. Scribes Josh Ward (Division 1), Giacomo Bruno (Division 2), Doug Long (Division 3) again led the way in covering their respective divisions, providing terrific feature pieces, weekly previews and match reports. Lucas

Apicella gave junior football fans and players content to look forward to every week with his weekly review, while Elly Kirlis and Casey McGuire did wonderful work to make sure our senior netball competition was extensively covered with weekly match reports.

Miles Earl, Matt Haug, Hamish Phillips, Sheridan van Gelderen and Bruno Visentini also provided written coverage across the 2023 campaign, and I thank them for their great work.

Club Development and Partnerships

The conclusion of last year's campaign saw my role develop into one that would see me take on a more holistic position in the NFNL for season 2023.

A role that consists of taking on Football Operations, Partnerships and Club Development comes with its challenges, but I am pleased to have experienced a successful year, which is largely thanks to the support of my colleagues, the league's fantastic partners, and those at club level who are respectful and understanding.

Season 2023 has seen significant innovation throughout the league, something that will continue next year and beyond. A key pillar for 2023 was to develop more robust and supportive working relationships with key NFNL stakeholders, something I believe was forged with stakeholders ranging from AFL Victoria, La Trobe University, Carlton Football Club and the Northern Knights as well as all our commercial and community partners.

To begin the year, the league hosted a series of online workshops for club representatives to attend, such as Child Safety education sessions led by industry experts, Bravehearts, and Good Sports workshops to assist clubs in correctly following liquor licensing laws.

In the pre-season, the league also hosted coaches' meetings online for the first time, which was a resounding success and saw a significant increase in attendance when compared to previous years.

The NFNL's partnership with club and culture development organisations such as Sport and Life Training (SALT), The Pat Cronin Foundation, and Tackle Your Feelings allowed clubs to support their members by delivering a range of educational workshops and programs designed to empower clubs to achieve the best possible outcomes, on and off the field.

In 2023, the NFNL forged a partnership with Australia's leading suicide prevention service, Lifeline. The league held an inaugural Lifeline Round to raise awareness for poor mental health, further strengthening our commitment to the mental wellbeing of our participants. The NFNL committed significantly to these wellbeing organisations through subsidised costs to clubs that hosted programs, and I thank all clubs for their commitment to improving the wellbeing of their players by taking part in these programs.

The NFNL has and will always encourage clubs to apply for grants and funding for support, and 2023 was no different. Clubs had access to various funding opportunities, including the TAC Club Rewards Program, AFL Victoria's Strategic Community Investment Fund (SCIF), The Get Active Kids Voucher Program, along with various other funding opportunities that were shared throughout the year. A big thank you to NFNL partner Yarra Valley Water for providing five clubs with funding opportunities throughout the season; we look forward to your ongoing support for years to come.

A big thank you must also go to the Local Government Authorities within the NFNL's regions; for not only providing clubs with a source for grant and funding opportunities, but for also assisting the league throughout the year in various ways from ground availability to being a general support contact.

The NFNL worked closely with the Club Development & Engagement team at AFL Victoria to improve the effectiveness of

programs run within the North and also Victoria-wide. These programs allow the standard of football and netball clubs in the NFNL to remain high.

The league went through an on-field apparel tender process this year, for the 2024, 2025 and 2026 seasons. We were presented with over 25 proposals from many high-calibre organisations throughout Australia, and the significant and stringent process allowed the league to renew agreements with Grashan Sportswear and Game Day Apparel for another three years, whilst also welcoming new on-field apparel partner Belgravia Apparel/New Balance to the league. I'd like to thank Starsub Apparel for their commitment to the league and wish them all the best moving forward.

Thank you to all our partners who continued supporting the Northern Football Netball League in 2023. The league is extremely thankful for your unwavering support, and we look forward to successful partnerships for years to come.

To new partners, Lifeline, Hamilton Recovery, Club Warehouse and Grayson's Gutter Guard Wallan, welcome to the league and thank you for the commitment throughout the season. A significant thank you to the league's new major partner, Air Fusion/Daikin, after coming on board to support the league's junior competitions; I look forward to a strong partnership for years to come.

Division 1 Review

Heidelberg kept their title as the most dominant team in the competition, as they claimed back-to-back premierships after another fantastic season in which they dropped just six points all year.

You could almost copy, and paste was written about Heidelberg 12 months ago and it wouldn't look out of place, as the Tigers were just as, if not arguably more, unstoppable than they were in 2022.

Their only major changes coming into the season was the appointment of Vin Dattoli as coach, as well as the departure of their leading goalkicker Joshua Minogue.

They were given a major scare in the opening round of the season, holding on to defeat North Heidelberg by a point, before Montmorency got the better of the reigning premiers a fortnight later, falling short by five points in Round 3.

They were then able to produce an eight-game winning streak afterwards until they faced the Magpies again in Round 12. In one of the games of the season, Heidelberg came back to produce a thrilling draw in a match they looked destined to lose.

It was a theme of the Tigers in 2023, as despite slow starts in games on occasion, they would deliver when it mattered to produce big results.

Heidelberg soon clicked into gear after that draw, going on to win their final eight games by an average margin of over 70 points. In that run they only conceded 50 or more points in three games and were able to score 100 or points in six matches.

After another minor premiership and a comfortable second semi-final win, Heidelberg took control of the grand final after quarter time to win their 22nd NFNL flag.

They again had stars all across the field, including Lachlan Wilson, who became a two-time Frank Rosbrook Medallist and Matthew Smith who became a two-time Grand Final best on ground medallist.

Captain Sam Gilmore was superb again this season alongside Keenan Posar and Brody Tardio who had improved campaigns, while Zane Barzen and Brayden Sier delivered inside the attacking half, combining for 81 majors.

It was almost Deja Vu for Bundoora who had an impressive second half to the year before falling short to Heidelberg again in the decider.

Looking to go one better than they did 12 months ago, the Bulls had one of the strongest recruiting sprees in the off-season, signing the likes of Lachlan East, Benjamin McNiece and Shaun McKernan, while obtaining the full-time services of Peter McEvoy.

Michael Ryan's men started the year with a three-game winning streak before dropping the next three matches and then winning the following four games. Injuries, unavailability, and a lack of depth saw the Bulls struggle to gain consistent form until Round 13, when they went on a run which saw them sneak into third spot and lose just two matches on their way to second consecutive Grand Final appearance.

Their average winning margin in that period was 60 points, with their most dominant performance coming in the preliminary final, when they blew North Heidelberg out of the water to win by 87 points.

Bundoora threw everything at Heidelberg in the grand final, but they were unable to hit the lead at any stage of the match, suffering a 25-point loss as a result.

Team of the Year representatives Jackson Davies, Lachlan East and Sam Lloyd led the charge, with the efforts of Davies and East in the backline seeing them concede an average of just 55 points in the home and away campaign.

A season that looked destined to finish on Grand Final day came to a sudden halt for Montmorency following a straight sets exit in 2023.

The Magpies recruited some key players to their squad in Jonathan Manzoney's first season as senior coach, with Lower Plenty pair Ben Paterson and Corey Sleep as well as former Melbourne ruck Jake Spencer joining the club.

They had a mixed bag of results in the first third of the year, with big wins against Heidelberg and Bundoora as well as a disappointing loss to Greensborough in Round 2 and a draw to Hurstbridge in Round 5.

Montmorency would remain unbeaten after that defeat to the Boro up until Round 13, a span which included wins against eventual top five sides in North Heidelberg and Bundoora, as well as a draw against top of the ladder Heidelberg to become the only side to take points away from the 2023 premiers throughout the season.

The Magpies would end the home and away campaign in second place, their best finish in a decade, and go into September on a five-game winning streak.

But Montmorency would again struggle to find form during the finals series, as they were unable to get past Bundoora in the qualifying final before they were soundly beaten by North Heidelberg the following week.

While they disappointed as a team in 2023, individually, plenty of Magpies shone bright, with Liam Wale-Buxton, Marcus Lentini and Sam Binion all having terrific years. The trio would finish in the top three in the Coaches MVP voting. Lentini would take out the award and join Wale-Buxton in finishing equal second in the Frank Rosbrook Medal count.

Meanwhile Patrick Fitzgerald was a force up forward, leading the competition goalkicking charts and earning a 10th Team of the Year appearance.

Having only just fallen short of finals action in 2022, North Heidelberg turned their luck around to feature heavily in September this season.

It would have been crazy to suggest that the Bulldogs would be preliminary finalists after their opening few weeks of the season, which included a one-point loss to Heidelberg in the opening round, a heavy loss to Bundoora in Round 2 and an 11-point defeat to Hurstbridge in Round 3.

The retirement of club and NFNL great Shane Harvey would spur his side to claim their first points of the season in a 48-point victory over Macleod and it would prove to be the firestarter the club needed, as they would win their next four games to climb into third.

Honourable losses to Montmorency and Heidelberg in the following fortnight didn't stop the Bulldogs' finals charge, as they went on another five-game winning streak. Defeats to Greensborough and Montmorency in the last few games of the season prevented North Heidelberg from clinching a double chance spot but as the finals proved, Jason Heatley's men had plenty more in the tank.

A big elimination final win over Hurstbridge was followed by an impressive first semi-final triumph over Montmorency, with both games resulting in the same 57-point margin. However, the Bulldogs fell away against Bundoora in the preliminary final and were no match from the opening siren.

North Heidelberg finished as the number one attacking team in the home and away campaign, kicking 100 points or more 11 times. A large reason for that was thanks to Majak Daw, who kicked 46 goals in 14 matches before kicking 12 majors in three finals games.

A historic year for Hurstbridge under new coach Joel Cordwell was culminated with a first ever finals appearance in the top flight. Along with Cordwell, Mitchell Moschetti and Kye Agosta headlined the many inclusions to the club in the off-season in an effort to make up for the loss of captain and multiple best and fairest winner Lachlan East.

Like last year, the Bridges began the 2023 season with a 2-1 record, but with those victories coming against the 2022 semi-finalist in West Preston-Lakeside as well as eventual preliminary finalists North Heidelberg, there was a lot of promise for the side.

They would continue to improve, with a tight win over Whittlesea followed by an impressive draw to Montmorency and a narrow loss to Heidelberg. The Bridges went 3-3 in the middle third of the home and away campaign, with two of the three defeats coming at Ben Frilay Oval, and also produced the same record in the final third of the campaign.

Wins in the final two matches of the season against Greensborough and Macleod solidified Hurstbridge's place in September, however it was a short-lived experience, as they conceded 13 goals to six after quarter time to go down by 57 points to North Heidelberg in the elimination final.

Moschetti impressed in his debut year with the club, earning a Team of the Year spot in the process, as did teammate William Cookson who finished in his side's best in 12 of 19 matches and was named on the wing in the final side. Bailey Jordan and Joel Naylor combined for 86 goals this season, with the latter also appearing in the final team.

Greensborough dealt with plenty of change ahead of the 2023 season, none more so than losing three of their best players from last year in Tom Bell, Zak McCubbin and Nick Riddle.

They did recruit Jack Newnes, however he only managed one game, while other recruits such as Jamie Smith and Nathan Howard had slightly more favourable campaigns.

An important victory over Macleod on Good Friday got the Boro on the right foot and they would quickly make their record 2-0 with an upset triumph over Montmorency.

Losses to West Preston-Lakeside and Heidelberg were offset by tight victories over Banyule and Bundoora to see them go to four wins in the opening third of the season, which was the same tally they achieved 12 months prior.

Greensborough then had a mixed bag of results in the middle of the year, highlighted by an away victory over Hurstbridge in Round 8, but a 35-point loss to Macleod two weeks later stopped any chance for Saade Ghazi's side to break away from the surrounding teams fighting for a spot in the finals.

The last six games of the year were where the Boro fell away, losing three straight games, which included letting a healthy lead slip against Banyule in Round 14, to fall outside the top five. A crucial Round 16 win over North Heidelberg gave them a lifeline, but it was their defeat at home to Hurstbridge the following week that sealed their fate, missing finals for the first time since 2013 as a result.

Greensborough were impressive defensively again in 2023, and led by Jack Johnston and Angus Sievers, they conceded the fourth least points to opposition sides this year. Both men would make the Team of the Year.

With big names joining the club in the off-season, there was plenty of hope that Macleod would be fighting hard to earn a finals spot in 2023, but a six-win campaign, their lowest win total in a full season since 2012, saw Macleod struggle to compete with the best in the competition.

After missing the finals by just six points for two consecutive full seasons, the club went hard at the recruiting table, signing Michael Hurley, Darcy Barden and Zac Hudson as the Roos looked to take the next step.

That trio debuted on Good Friday against Greensborough but were unable to get their side over the line. They went 0-2 after defeat to West Preston-Lakeside but bounced back to triumph in two of their next three games, including a confidence boosting 122-point victory over Whittlesea.

But the gap between Macleod and the top sides in the competition was illustrated between Round's 6-9, as they lost all four games to sides who would go on to play finals in 2023.

Their fortunes turned around briefly in the second half of the season, claiming three consecutive wins to jump right back into the finals conversation, but by only defeating Whittlesea in the final third of the home and away season, the Roos would be unable to mount a serious finals threat.

The form of Darcy Barden in his first season at Macleod was a major positive for Craig Hayes, with his versatility and his excellent intercepting ability across half back seeing him be the sole Team of the Year representative from the club.

A notable first year in the top flight for the Bears was capped off with survival and promise that they can be even more competitive in 2024.

Banyule wasted no time in recruiting some key players to their side ahead of this year's campaign, with Max Jones, Vivian Blackmoore-Moore and Kurt Aylett all going on to have solid seasons at Beverley Road Oval.

The Bears showed their capabilities of competing with the best from their opening



match against Bundoora, as despite falling short by eight points, they came from 42 points down at half time to achieve an admirable result. It set them up to claim their first Division 1 win the following week when they comfortably defeated Hurstbridge by 42 points.

Banyule also established a mini rivalry with Greensborough throughout the course of the year, with both matches being decided by a total of just eight points. In Round 5, 10 goals were kicked between the two sides in the last term, with the Bears just falling short at Greensborough War Memorial Park, before they were on the other side of a close one in Round 14, when they prevailed by three points in front of their home crowd.

Kye Yodgee was excellent for the side and showcased his talent in the second half of the year, being named in his side's best in seven of the final nine matches of the season, a period where Banyule only claimed two wins.

A tough year with plenty of change for West Preston-Lakeside saw them go from a semi-final appearance last season to a ninth-place finish in 2023. Luke Giles took over from two-time premiership coach Rob Maiorana and with a young squad, the Roosters were a bit of an unknown approaching the season.

The side had a balanced opening third to the home and away campaign, losing a tight encounter to Hurstbridge in Round 1 before turning the tables to defeat Macleod by nine points the following week.

Round 3 was where they arguably produced their win of the season, after they held off a fast-finishing Greensborough side on multiple occasions in the final term to prevail by three points. Max Dreher finished as his side's best on that day and had a terrific year overall, earning a Team of the Year spot. Mohammed Yassine and Chris Ryall both ended up with three majors in the win and would prove to be the club's most influential recruits in 2023.

West Preston-Lakeside started to fade away from the rest of the competition from Round 6, when they won just two more games for the remainder of the season and went on to lose their final five matches by 40 points or more.

Ahmed Saad and Mark Kovacevic made successful returns after long-term injuries, with Saad wasting no time in getting back to his goalkicking best, finishing with 35 goals in 13 games.

Whittlesea were off the pace in 2023, producing a winless campaign to be relegated from Division 1 for the fourth time in 11 years. Wayne van der Ross stepped in as senior coach and despite losing personnel from last year, a young Eagles outfit looked eager to avoid the drop.

However, it was soon apparent that Whittlesea would struggle at both ends of the field, conceding 98 points a game while scoring just 40 points a match across the home and away campaign.

Some highlights included Round 12 against eventual Grand Finalists Bundoora, where after a one-goal to six opening term, they came back to trail by four points at three quarter time before falling short by 17 points.

There were also some great individual seasons from Whittlesea players, including Christian Prestopino, who kicked bags of five against Heidelberg and Hurstbridge, as well as VFL listed star Blake Watson, who despite playing just 10 matches, was named in his side's best in eight of them.

Mitchell Andrews and Xavier Dimasi were the most consistent contributors across the season alongside Deakin Tennant, who impressed in the back half.

Although Division 2 looms for the Eagles, the appointment of Garry Ramsay as coach for the next two years will give the club plenty of hope that their return to the top flight will be imminent.

DROUGHT OVER

Six Grand Final goals from Eltham star Finnbar Maley saw the Panthers break their senior men's premiership drought in MC Labour Division 2.

Division 2 Review

Eltham finally completed their quest of achieving promotion to the top flight, having fallen short in previous campaigns, after winning the 2023 grand final in convincing fashion over Diamond Creek.

The Panthers were more determined than ever to end their senior men's premiership drought and wasted no time in bolstering their squad following their grand final defeat last year. New coach Tim Bongetti as well as star recruits Jesse Donaldson and Tom Goodwin made an immediate impact, with the Panthers dropping just two games for the home and away campaign, both at the hands of the minor premiers in Diamond Creek.

They would complete the season with 16 wins and a second placed finish and would also head into September with three consecutive 60+ point victories, which was form they continued to bring to the first week of finals, where they comfortably defeated St Mary's by 78 points.

When they faced the Creekers in the second semi-final, Eltham took control in the second term, and despite a fightback from their opponents, the Panthers rallied hard in the final quarter to win their way to a third decider since 2018.

They would face the same side a fortnight later with a similar story unfolding, as they kicked 12 goals to five after quarter time to finally taste silverware in the senior men's competition. Their rousing 41-point win came courtesy of Finnbar Maley, who starred inside 50 with six goals in just his sixth game of the season.

When he did play, he formed a brilliant tandem with Tom Goodwin in ruck and up forward. Donaldson starred around the ground and polled well in the best and fairest count and Coaches MVP Award.

Declan Ayres meanwhile had a brilliant breakout campaign which saw him finish in his side's best in 11 of 20 games and earn a Team of the Year appearance.

After a strong 2022 campaign which saw them break their five-year finals drought and reach the preliminary final, Diamond Creek were hoping those achievements would be a springboard towards a strong 2023 season.

The Creekers started brightly, winning their first four games before suffering a surprise defeat to Panton Hill in Round 5. Their response in Round 6 was excellent, when they were victors over an undefeated Eltham side away from home, and it proved to be the tone setter for the remainder of the home and away campaign, as they finished the regular season as minor premiers.

However, their finals series didn't quiet go to plan. They fell to the Panthers in the second semi-final by 25 points, their first defeat since May, and while they proved too strong for a gallant St Mary's outfit in the preliminary final, they struggled to keep up with Eltham after quarter time in the decider.

Their improved season came from a range of factors, none more prominent than their impressive defensive traits. A backline led by Team of the Year duo Joel Randall and Nathan

Searl, as well as Billy Bedford and Matthew Lewis, helped Diamond Creek concede just under 40 points a game in the home and away campaign.

Another factor came through the benefit of having Jacob Booth for the entire campaign, as after playing five games in the last two years combined, the VFL listed talent had a terrific season at Coventry Oval, being named in his side's best in 10 of 15 games and kicking 29 majors.

The heartbreak of 2022 seemed to spur St Mary's into a club best campaign this year, reaching their first ever finals series in Division 2.

Whilst they lost talented ruck Zac Hudson, the recruitment of Jeremiah Antypas and Jack Bianchin would prove to have a major impact on the Burra's improved season.

They did face a tough start to the year, going down to newly promoted South Morang in the opening round of the season before suffering a heavy defeat to Eltham the following week. They bounced back to win three straight games, but further defeats saw them go 3-4 after Round 7.

However, that's when their turnaround began, as Fabian Carelli's men would only lose three of their final 11 games of the home and away season, posting scores of 90 or more in five of those victories, to finish in third spot.

Their inaugural finals campaign got off to a rocky start, when they proved no match for a dominant Eltham side in the qualifying final, however their second chance allowed them to showcase their best football, when they defeated South Morang in an entertaining semi-final.

St Mary's faced the minor premiers in Diamond Creek and while they put up a good fight early, the Burra were unable to limit the Creekers scoring power, going down by 47 points.

Other highlights in the club's improved 2023 season included Tane Cotter, who would become the Division 2 best and fairest. Rory Hanlon also excelled in midfield and was rewarded with a Team of the Year appearance while Huon MacGibbon was strong in the ruck, particularly during the finals campaign.

Optimism was high for South Morang, after they secured promotion to Division 2 the season prior, though no one could've foreseen just how much of a competitive outfit they would turn out to be.

Keeping their premiership squad from 2022 as well as adding a host of talented names such as Joshua D'Intinosante, Lachlan Potter and Gary Moorcroft, the Lions would begin the year with a bang, winning their first three games of the season by an average margin of just over 54 points.

Despite back-to-back losses to the eventual grand finalists, Gary Hall's side continued to

produce wins, and would find themselves 7-2 and occupying third position at the halfway point of the season.

With injury and unavailability impacting South Morang in the second half of the home and away campaign, the side would claim victory just once between Round's 10 and 15, suddenly putting them in danger of dropping out of the top five. But the Lions' steadied the ship to win two of their final three matches to secure fourth place.

South Morang would produce one of their best performances of the year in a 79-point triumph over Watsonia in the elimination final but were unable to repeat the dose the following week against St Mary's, going down by 21 points to end their 2023 campaign.

Joshua D'Intinosante was a livewire up forward, finishing the year with 45 goals, 13 of which came in his two finals appearances. Tye Hall was immense around the ground and finished in his side's best in seven of his last eight games, while Deacon Kalpakis had a breakout season in defence.

Following signs of improvement last year, the Saints were tipped to contend for finals again in 2023, even though they were heading into the campaign without their two Team of the Year representatives from last year in Lachlan Potter and Kyle Wheatley.

As they did in Round 1 of 2022, Watsonia began the season with a win over Lower Plenty, this time in more convincing fashion. The big wins continued into the following week when a massive triumph over Panton Hill saw them go 2-0.

Inconsistency started to creep into the Saints form throughout the middle parts of the season and there was no certainty that the Saints would be finals bound. But, important victories over Thomastown, South Morang and Northcote Park in the final third of the home and away campaign would prove to be enough to see Watsonia book their first finals appearance in Division 2 for 15 years.

Their one and only finals match was disappointing way to end the year, as they conceded seven goals to one in the opening term of the elimination final on their way to falling to South Morang by 79 points.

With a void to fill up forward, James Lucente rose to the task, and had a brilliant season, kicking 61 goals to finish as the competition's leading goalkicker, while Joshua Boulton was a rock in defence, earning a Team of the Year appearance and being in his side's best in 12 of 16 games in 2023.

Under new mentor Peter Bugden, Thomastown were hopeful of not just another finals appearance in 2023, but to also produce a deep run that could challenge the best sides in the competition.

Off-season recruits such as Joshua Mazzarella and Makhoul Zakkour sparked optimism for the Bears and after a handy opening round victory over Epping on Good Friday, their intentions looked set. But inconsistent performances again started to trouble Thomastown as important victories came with tough losses.

In Round 7 they led by 34 points at half time against Panton Hill before conceding nine of the last 13 goals to salvage a draw away from home. Their most impressive win of the season came in Round 11 when they kicked 10 goals to three after half time to prevail by 56 points over eventual finalists South Morang at Mill Park Lakes Reserve.



After Round 14 following a second defeat to Northcote Park, the Bears were in seventh place and still six points away from the top five, as Bugden announced he would not continue as coach in 2024.

They would go on to win three of their last four matches but unlike the conclusion of last year, Thomastown didn't produce a fairytale run to the finals, finishing two points behind Watsonia to miss finals for the first time since 2017.

Tyrone Leonardis was a standout for the Bears, going on to win the Division 2 Coaches MVP Award in dominant fashion, and also earning his side's most votes in the Division 2 league best and fairest count, equal with Lawrence Lopiccio. Daniel Caruso was solid in defence and would finish in the Team of the Year alongside Leonardis.

After a three-win campaign in the top flight last year, Northcote Park came into the 2023 season ambitious, as they looked to make their return to Division 2 a short one, but as the year went on, it had turned into a tough fight to play finals.

Northcote Park had an even first half to the season, highlighted by important home victories over Panton Hill, Thomastown and Watsonia, putting them right in the finals conversation at the end of Round 9 with a 5-4 record. But the second half of the year is where Stephen Saddington's men started to fall behind the eight ball.

In hindsight, defeats to Panton Hill, St Mary's, South Morang and Watsonia between Round's 11 to 17 were the difference between the Cougars making and missing finals action. What would sting more is the fact that all four of those defeats were by just 18 points or less, and by finishing only one game behind fifth placed Watsonia, it could have been a different story had those results flipped the other way.

Daniel Tallariti backed up his 2022 club best and fairest award with another outstanding year in defence, earning him a spot in the Team of the Year as a result. Christopher Clark and Matthew Perry led the way in midfield, with the latter being one of only four players to play every game in 2023.

Alexander Boyse finished with 28 goals for the season, which included at least one major in his first six games, but as only one of five players who kicked 10 or more goals this year, he will hope to gain more support next year.

With an encouraging backend to the 2022 campaign and an eventful off-season which saw multiple recruits join the club such as Tom Keys and Riley Livingstone, it was expected that Panton Hill would fare much better in 2023 and make a push for finals.

But they could only muster 10 more points than their total last year and struggled to be in the finals hunt late in the season. Their campaign got off to a poor start when they lost their opening three matches by an average margin of 62 points before five straight goals in the last quarter saw them defeat Lower Plenty in Round 4 to get off the mark.

The following week would see the Redbacks produce their best win of the year when they travelled to Coventry Oval and kept Diamond Creek to just six goals on their way to a nine-point triumph.

It looked to be the turning point in their 2023 season as they followed their upset win with a 23-point victory over St Mary's, a come from behind draw against Thomastown and a powerful triumph over Epping, which saw Panton Hill to move to 4-3-1 after eight rounds.

But they would start to fall away from the pack in the second half of the campaign, winning just three of their final 10 matches of the home and away season, with their four-point loss to winless Lower Plenty in Round 13 all but spelling the end of their finals aspirations.

Both Keys and Livingstone impressed in their first seasons at A.E. Cracknell Reserve while captain Samuel Parks earnt another Team of the Year appearance.

After a straight set exit last year, Lower Plenty saw a plethora of their top players depart, including reigning league best and fairest Darcy Barden and star midfielder Tom Keys. As a result, Phil Plunkett had an almost completely new side at his disposal, filled with plenty of youth; but they were able to recruit Patrick Flynn back to the club following a stint at Macleod.

From the outset, the year looked to be a difficult one for the Bears, as they struggled to keep up with many sides in the competition. Their two best chances of victory in the first half of the season came and went, after they fell by 22 points to Panton Hill in Round 4 and 43 points to Epping in Round 7, two sides who had yet to register a win at those respective stages.

Things started to improve slightly for Lower Plenty afterwards, with a highlight being a gallant performance in Round 9 against Eltham where they lost by just 11 points. A disappointing 139-point defeat to Diamond Creek, in which they registered just one behind, saw the Bears' chance of survival reduce significantly, but their response against the Redbacks the following week was excellent, as they prevailed by four points in a terrific game.

A fortnight later, they would produce the triumph that would ultimately assure them of survival, as a strong second half saw them defeat Epping by 33 points.

Patrick Flynn and Jordan Sacco were the two main men that got Lower Plenty over the line, with Flynn earning 12 mentions in the best in 17 matches.

Having narrowly avoided relegation last season, the Blues would be unable to achieve the same feat in 2023, claiming just one win for the home and away campaign. You could argue however that Epping were a far more competitive outfit than they were in 2022.

Signs of their improvement came from the opening game of the year, when they kept Thomastown goalless at quarter time to lead by 16 points, although they would go on to lose by 73 points. Epping went 9-9 in first term's this year, which included opening quarter wins against finals sides such as Watsonia in Round 5, St Mary's in Round 9, South Morang in Round 12 and Eltham in Round 13.

But they would fail to maintain the rage throughout matches as proven in those four highlighted games, as they would go on to fall by an average losing margin of 40 points. Their inability to run out games was the story of their season.

Their only victory came in Round 7 against Lower Plenty where they produced an impressive 43-point triumph, however going down to them later in the season in Round 16 sunk the Blues back to the bottom of the ladder, where they remained until season's end.

Captain Leigh Judd led from the front and was their most consistent performer of the season. He was named in his side's best in 12 of 18 games, earned another Team of the Year appearance and picked up his side's most votes in the best and fairest. He was also one of just three players to play every match in 2023.

POWERING UP

In one of the great Heidelberg Golf Club Division 3 Grand Finals, Laurimar came from behind late in the final term, to claim their first piece of NFN silverware.

Division 3 Review

In only its fifth completed season in the NFNL, Laurimar claimed their first premiership, but it was a tough slog to achieve that feat, with two finals games against Mernda going down to the wire.

Many pundits had tipped Laurimar as the likely premiership team prior to the start of the 2023 campaign, and while that tip turned out to be correct, their path to glory was probably more difficult than many anticipated.

Keeping much of the same squad that saw them reach the club's first grand final last year, the Power produced a comfortable win over Kilmore to start the season, but it was soon followed by a shock loss to Mernda the following week.

After a defeat to the newly introduced Kinglake in Round 7, the Power found themselves back in third spot on the table and had to fight hard for the remainder of the season to ensure they would receive the double chance. Jimmy Atkins' men eventually grabbed second spot on the ladder by prevailing in seven of their last eight games.

Things were looking good for the Power in the second semi-final against the Demons when they led by 22-points at the final change. But the Demons booted four unanswered goals to briefly hit the front. Noah Mooney then stepped up for Laurimar, goaling twice after taking two terrific marks, allowing his side to take the shortcut into the grand final.

The rematch in the final game of the season against Mernda proved to be an all-time contest. This time it was the Demons who looked the goods for the latter part of the contest, but the Power fought back in time on of the final term before a goal just prior to the siren by Jacson Cecil sealed the deal for Laurimar.

Laurimar finished with six players in the Team of the Year, with Mooney, as well as co-captains Mitchell Thompson and Luke Wilson being the side's most consistent players of the season. Wilson would go on to finish as the Division 3 Coaches MVP.

Mernda fans had waited a long time for a finals appearance as they approached the 2023 campaign. The wait was made more frustrating after narrow misses in 2018 and 2019, followed by the two missed seasons of 2020 and 2021.

But this year would be different, as they not only ended their post-season drought, but they also finished on top of the ladder for the first time since 1997, before just falling short in the final match of the season.

Despite having promising juniors coming through the ranks at the club, expectations for this year's campaign were low outside the four walls at Waterview Recreation Reserve, however recruits such as Billy Morrison and Daniel Smith would prove to be influential.

The Demons started the year in great form, defeating two top teams from the previous season in Old Eltham Collegians and Laurimar in the opening two rounds. Travelling to Kinglake Memorial Oval to play the unbeaten Lakers in Round 3, a tight tussle was expected, and while the hosts led by 70 points at three quarter time, the Demons brought the margin back to fall short by 36 points.

That loss didn't derail Mernda, who went on to win their next six straight matches while only dropping one more loss for the rest of the season. Entering the finals series on the back of that strong form, they were gallant in the second semi-final but went down to the Power by a narrow margin before getting back to their best in a terrific 36-point preliminary final win over Old Eltham Collegians.

It was that same form they brought into their first grand final appearance in 11 years the following week. The Demons had control at various points of the match and twice led by 17 points in the final term but were unable to hold off a fast-finishing Laurimar side.

While Morison and Kellett impressed, multiple players produced breakout campaigns, including Kai Turner, who scored a half back flank spot in the Team of the Year, and Joel Harris who was named in his side's best in nine of 17 games.

In a terrific season, Old Eltham Collegians made the finals in 2022, getting as far as the preliminary final, and after a bunch of recruits joined the club in the off-season, headlined by eventual competition leading goalkicker Matthew Williamson, there was optimism that the club could reach greater heights this year.

While many may have expected the Turtles to fight it out for a top two finish, they spent most of the season in and around fourth spot, mainly challenging with Heidelberg West for that final position in the top four.

They twice went down to the Hawks but were able to pull off some impressive wins over top three teams which helped them secure a second straight finals berth.

A 40-point win over Kinglake in Round 6 and a seven-point triumph over Laurimar in Round 14 were the key victories for the Turtles in the regular season. In fact, Matt Sleeman's men went within a kick of making it a clean sweep of the Power, losing their other match by just three points.

Needing a win in the final round of the season in order to play finals, Old Eltham Collegians cruised to a big victory over Kilmore to qualify. It was hard to predict the outcome of the first semi-final when the Turtles and Lakers clashed, but the former controlled the contest and triumphed to the tune of 24 points.

It was a tougher assignment the next week, with the penultimate game of the season proving that Old Eltham Collegians were no match for Mernda, as they went down by 36 points.

Williamson was excellent up forward, kicking 66 majors, while Sebastian Francis-Perkins controlled the midfield and Timothy Ellis impressed down back. The trio would all be named in the Team of the Year alongside Nicholas Milne.

Following a Grand Final appearance in their final season in the Outer East Football Netball



League last year, Kinglake would adjust well to Division 3 football in the NFNL.

Despite there being plenty of unknown about how they would fare in the competition, the Lakers exceeded all expectations early in the 2023 campaign when they went 5-0. The most impressive win in this block was a 36-point victory over a Mernda side who had just come off back-to-back wins over Old Eltham Collegians and Laurimar.

The winning run came to an end in Round 6 with a 40-point loss to Old Eltham Collegians at Eltham College, however they bounced back the following week on their home ground to defeat eventual premiers Laurimar by 30 points, it would prove to be the Power's biggest loss for the season.

Kinglake went to the mid-season break at 7-1 with a finals berth virtually locked in, and the goal of grabbing the coveted double chance was set in the back half of the campaign.

However, defeats to both Mernda and Laurimar away saw the Lakers fall to third spot on the table by the end of the home and away season.

With the aim of playing finals achieved, Andrew Fairchild and his men set their sights on going deep into the finals series. They had the upper hand in the first semi-final against Old Eltham Collegians for small periods of the game but went down by 24 points, ending their campaign.

Kinglake were represented well in the Team of the Year with captain Bailey Robinson and leading goalkickers Leigh Gilbert and Damian Pywell all earning spots in the side. Robinson particularly impressed and ended up with the club's most votes in the league's Division 3 best and fairest count.

Heidelberg West have been on the cusp of breaking their finals drought for the last few years and once again, finished the 2023 season on 10 wins. But, as last year was an 18-game campaign, this year's effort in winning ten from sixteen can be seen as an improvement.

The Hawks were locked in a battle for fourth spot with Old Eltham Collegians for most of the year and while they were able to beat the Turtles in two impressive performances this season, they would go 1-5 against top three sides in 2023. That one win came in the penultimate round of the home and away season, when they defeated Kinglake.

That victory still gave Michael Missen's side a chance at finals action in the final round, and while they were all but certain to claim the four points over Lalor, a Kilmore upset over the Turtles was needed on the same day, which did not eventuate.

In retrospect, their home loss to the Blues in Round 5 could be argued as the costliest defeat, as it began a four-game losing streak which saw them head to the mid-season break with a 3-4 record.

For the second consecutive year, Heidelberg West would have four players represent the club in the Team of the Year, with Bradley Moore and Alex Hywood earning another selection.

Lachlan Evans, who was placed on the bench in the final side, went on to win the Division 3 best and fairest after a terrific season in ruck,

while Daniel Kelly was a handy recruit after coming across from Banyule.

Kilmore had seen finals action in the past two completed seasons (2019 and 2022) but dropped out of contention in 2023.

Four losses either side of the mid-season break proved to be the catalyst to the Blues' inability to make a genuine charge at a top four finish this season.

It was always going to be a challenge for Paul Derrick and his team after they lost several key players in the off-season, headlined by the exit of two-time league best and fairest Chris Ryall.

There were some bright spots for the Blues during the season, none more so than when they defeated finals contender Heidelberg West by two points in Round 5; away from home, it was a major achievement for the club.

They would have a great mini-battle with the Fitzroy Stars in 2023, as despite falling short against them in Round 8, they secured sixth position on the ladder with a brilliant 45-point win over the Stars at J.J. Clancy Reserve.

Christopher Barton was another standout for the side this year, for the second straight season he finished in the Team of the Year and finished with the most appearances in his side's best. He also earned his side's most votes in the Division 3 best and fairest count along with Michael Marrett.

After some difficult years in Division 2, the Fitzroy Stars' first season in Division 3 saw them have an immediate impact, ending a 658-day winning drought by defeating Lalor in the opening round of the season.

Things were to get tougher after that, with the Stars falling in four consecutive matches against the eventual top five sides of the competition, making their 1-4 record a tough starting point if they were to feature in finals action.

But a glimmer of hope appeared after their Round 6 bye. They scored their biggest win of the season with a 119-point triumph over Reservoir and then hosted Kilmore the next week at Sir Douglas Nicholls Oval. It was playing coach Lionel Proctor's 200th game and in tough and heavy conditions, the two combatants produced a competitive game which saw the Stars prevail by 13 points.

The back-to-back victories took the Stars to a 3-4 record at the mid-season break, but any faint hopes of finals disappeared in the second half of the 2023 campaign as they were not able to string consecutive wins together.

Their form fluctuated wildly at times. Round 10 almost provided the upset of the season when a wayward Stars team hung on to defeat the Bloods by a mere three points, while in Round's 12 and 13, the Stars went within 10-points of upsetting both the Turtles and the Power.

Fitzroy Stars recruited multiple former names back to the club ahead of the 2023 season, none having more of a prolific campaign than Jai Burns, who narrowly missed the Division 3 Coaches MVP Award, but was named as the club's only representative in the Team of the Year.

Since winning the Division 3 premiership in 2015, going into recess the following year and then re-forming in 2017, it has been a slow build for the Mustangs.

The 2023 season saw Reservoir also clean sweep the Bloods, but their first encounter in Round 6 at Lalor Reserve didn't prove to be an easy task to overcome. Mustang fans had to wait for a missed kick on the full-time siren from the Bloods in order to claim a tight two-point victory.

The rematch at Crispe Park in Round 15 was a more dominant performance as the hosts ran away with a 55-point triumph.

Although progress is slow, the team continues to be heading in the right direction, increasing their total percentage from 14.23 in 2022 to 22.33 this season, while just like last year, their competitiveness improved as the season went on. They also produced their highest points total since 2019.

Robert Holland made it consecutive years in which he finished as his side's highest vote getter in the league best and fairest award. He also finished in his side's best in 10 of 15 games.

Ryan Evans and Zane Pugliese-Thompson were some of the other more consistent players for Justin George's side in 2023.

With more list changes ahead of the 2023 season, Lalor again struggled to compete with their Division 3 opponents in most games this season.

Despite not recording a victory for the second straight campaign, Bloods fans were treated to two nail-biting battles on their home ground.

There was a big build-up to the Round 6 game against Reservoir as both teams hadn't tasted victory coming into the contest. The game was up for grabs until the final siren, but regrettably for Lalor, their late shot on the full-time siren just missed, and they fell short by just two points.

Many would have expected that their only other chance for a win this year would come in the return match at Crispe Park later in the season. But the Round 10 contest against the Fitzroy Stars saw the Bloods have a significant lead midway through the game, before their opponents clawed their way back, seeing Lalor go down by only three points.

The re-match with Reservoir in Round 15 was competitive early, but the Mustangs eventually ran away with the game late to record a 55-point triumph.

Competitiveness will again be key in 2024 as they lost five of their last six matches by 150 points or more, and with a new coach at the helm in Bloods and AFL legend Lance Whitnall, there is renewed optimism that the club start to rise again next year.

Montmorency were one of three teams to claim their first premiership in the NFNL women's competition in 2023.

Women's Review

More history was made in the NFNL senior women's football competition this year, as three new premiers were crowned to culminate what was a terrific season.

Despite the departure of VU Western Spurs from the league, along with Bundoora and Lower Plenty being unable to field any sides in 2023, the competition welcomed senior women's teams from Heidelberg West and North Heidelberg for the first time, with each having a great influence in Division 3.

Six teams took part in the Heidelberg Golf Club Division 1 women's competition, with Darebin, Diamond Creek Women's, Montmorency and West Preston-Lakeside again taking their place in the division. Greensborough would move to Division 2 after playing the opening four matches of the Division 1 campaign, while Eltham (at the start of the season) and Banyule (after Round 4) found spots in the top flight after strong 2022 campaigns in Division 2.

The make-up of the top four wasn't decided until the final match of the home and away season. Montmorency dominated throughout the year, losing just one match in the regular campaign to finish as minor premiers, while Banyule were able to drift away from the pack late, with their two-point victory over Eltham in Round 14 sewing up a double chance spot.

The Panthers had challenged the top two sides all season, but had to settle for third position, meanwhile last year's grand finalists in Darebin and Diamond Creek Women's would produce an intriguing battle for the last spot in the top four.

In the first match of the final home and away round, the Creekers upset Banyule to momentarily jump into fourth on percentage, however the Falcons would cause a surprise of their own, with victory over Eltham the following day, securing another finals berth for the club.

West Preston-Lakeside would have a difficult campaign. With some of their stronger players on VFLW duty throughout the year, the Roosters only managed two wins in 2023.

The Panthers and Falcons would meet again in the first semi-final, but Darebin were unable to replicate their historic finals run from 12 months prior, going down by seven points. In the second semi-final, Montmorency prevailed to advance to the decider, but were made to work hard by a gallant Banyule outfit, who only fell five

points short of upsetting the Magpies.

A close preliminary final ended with Banyule running away in the final term to book their first grand final appearance in the women's competition.

Montmorency looked in control during the decider at Preston City Oval the following week, but inaccuracy kept the Bears in the hunt at half time as they trailed by only seven points. However, the minor premiers went up another gear in the second half, kicking five goals to two on their way to premiership success.

Maykaylah Appleby had an excellent season with Diamond Creek Women's, finishing in her side's best in eight of 14 matches and kicking 16 goals. In a tight Division 1 women's best and fairest count, she received votes in the final round of the season to become the second Creekers player to claim the award.

The player Appleby snuck past to win the best and fairest, Montmorency's Emily Beanland, would receive the Division 1 Coaches MVP Award to go along with her best on ground medal in her side's grand final triumph. Meanwhile Linda Thorp made it a third straight competition leading goalkicker award after kicking 29 majors.

The Cleaning Melbourne Division 2 women's competition saw St Mary's dominate from May onwards, and despite having to find some late goals in the grand final, they would go one better than 2022 and finish the season as premiers.

Their grand final opponent and most prominent challenger over the course of this year's campaign was Heidelberg, who produced a strong season themselves.





Mernda came up to Division 2 in Round 4 and didn't look out of place, going on to finish in third spot while Greensborough played some great football in the second half of the season to claim fourth position.

The Fitzroy Stars had another improved year and made it back-to-back top five finishes in Division 2, ahead of Whittlesea and Hurstbridge.

Heidelberg would have the better of Mernda in the qualifying final before a great elimination final was played out between Greensborough and the Fitzroy Stars, with the latter prevailing by 12 points to win their first final in the women's competition.

The Stars' form would continue into the semi-final the next week, as they produced a brilliant 70-point triumph over Mernda to advance to the preliminary final. In the same weekend, St Mary's were the first team into the decider following a 26-point semi-final victory over Heidelberg.

The Tigers would bounce back in the preliminary final by recording a 31-point win over the Stars.

In the grand final, both teams were neck and neck, with Heidelberg seemingly able to respond to every St Mary's push forward. After three points separated the two sides heading into the final term, it was the Tigers who had the lead halfway through the last quarter, before two late goals would prove enough to see the Burra win a high-quality decider.

Following a terrific best and fairest winning campaign in Division 3 last year, Mernda's Gulia Ceravolo would win the Division 2 league best and fairest in 2023, becoming the second player in the history of the NFNL senior women's competition to win multiple league best and fairest awards.

Greensborough's Emmison Zealley would finish as the Division's Coaches MVP Award winner, while St Mary's recruit Megan Girolami went on to become the competition's leading goalkicker with 32 goals.

Wallan put their case forward to become the story of the season during their NFNL Division 3 women's campaign, as they went from a two-win season in 2022, to a premiership flag in 2023.

After moving to Division 3 following the first four rounds of the season, Darebin paralleled the feats of the club's Division 1 side last year, as they won three finals matches from fourth position to reach the grand final.

A new women's team in Heidelberg West would impress in their inaugural campaign, finishing in second position and becoming the only side to defeat Wallan in 2023.

Montmorency (third) and Diamond Creek Women's (fifth) were the other teams to feature in finals action, while North Heidelberg were competitive in their first women's season, finishing one game away from a place in the top five, but ultimately claiming more wins than Laurimar and West Preston-Lakeside.

The Falcons became the highlight of the first three weeks of the finals series, winning their three finals by a combined margin of 16 points to book a spot in the decider. This included a terrific preliminary final against Heidelberg West, where a late goal in the final term sealed a three-point triumph.

While they were able to keep up with Wallan for most of the grand final, they were unable to find the go-ahead goal in the second half, with the Magpies completing their 12-month turnaround with a seven-point victory in the final game of the season.

Wallan premiership captain Kelly Lennox would have an outstanding year, as she earned a second consecutive Team of the Year appearance and finished as the competition's best and fairest in 2023.

Heidelberg West duo Chloe Rowan and Ashleigh Riley would pick up the other individual awards from the division, winning the Coaches MVP Award and competition leading goalkicker award respectively.
